22 plowed the corn field for potatoes

23 went to the outlet & drew out the Bar  
timber that I'd got out in the winter Russel & Perry  
brought it there in a raft I paid them <sup>on Tuesday</sup> four dollars

left the  
chairs out for  
the first  
night  
I went to  
Middlebrook  
to see about  
the Shenong timber  
it has not got dragged  
there yet they  
give only  
12 cents a piece  
for bringing the  
timber down

24 the Rev. W. Matthews came here this morning he  
came on the night Express Henry rolled them

for potatoes it is very lumpy & plowed the  
in the garden in Monroes the ground is very dry

25 went to Fairfax this morning with W. Matthews he  
preached in the morning & in the church in the evening

26 made two steps for the wash shed & cleaned it out  
got the floor laid ready for the stove

27 scraped in the sand pit in the forenoon drew  
6 loads of sand in the afternoon for Dr. Hysworth  
108 bushel I helped Henry to load & clear away the  
bad sand

28 raked & planted the carrots in the forenoon the ground  
is very dry Henry rolled the church field before  
supper he then drew 2 loads of sand for Dr. Hysworth

29 Henry rolled part of the North-east field & furrowed  
out part of the potato ground the ground is very  
dry

30 fine rain last night 3 1/2 bushel of early rose & 4 1/2  
of chilies there was cut 6 hole ones

31 finished the potato plants 2 1/2 rows of beans  
the road plowed more beans in the garden  
forenoon I fixed the wagon on a new axle for a new  
wagon Henry went to Haldenstown in the afternoon
