the case in order to let the counsel arrange terms
among themselves so whether they have argued the
point or not I can't make out nor can any of us.

to town as Aunt Ella is here at Aunt's and they wanted
her to see the children. She was delighted with them

and took Mrs. Sherry & Amy their eggs and got some meat.
We then collected the other two kids and came home as it was
looking very rainy & Mary had bread ready for the oven.
A cable gram came to-day reading - "Sittings yesterday & to-day
adjourned June 2nd & 4th." Cash says they skip next week on account
of what some call holidays.
