- 3. Jimmie left for Ansonia to Mrs John McCree's  
 funeral which be tomorrow
- 4. To 2 loaves 12
- 5. Jimmie was home this morning at 5.  
 Sent my church money by Maudy 25  
 The H. School Cadets were in the Church, in  
 all their kilts 40 strong Mr Govin preached  
 a good sermon
- 6. The Cadets left for Kingston for a week  
 Jimmie went with them. 2 loaves 12
- 7. Ann working 50.00
- 8. The W.H. Mc were to come here to quilt, but it  
 poured rain all afternoon, so they went to the
