

August Sunday 14 1927

Attended morning service at church and heard Mr. Wilson preach for first time after his holidays. Had a picnic lunch for dinner up home right shower at noon. All of us kids went for a swim over to the old hole in the afternoon and had a great time diving etc. Then we older folks had a saw ride back to the root field and the Carl and his gang brought us home in time for chow. After a pleasant day.

Monday 15

Dan cut and I shocked all the three corned piece of oats in the morning and then we worked the rest of the day at the same job in the big field. Dan and I took a walk over to see Piffers barn after supper. Cummings came down for a visit and I had some nice dances with Jean.

Tuesday 16

I shocked oats all morning and Dan finished cutting the oat crop for 1927 a little after twelve. Drove in ten loads of oats in afternoon when Mr. Piffers and his two men came over and we drove with two teams. Went back to finish shocking oats after milking and maybe it wasn't pleasant to have Jean come back and help me in the twilight through

August Wednesday 17 1927

Put in one of the heaviest days work in my life when I pitched hay all day over at Piffers when we got in 21 loads. Had a nice walk over home at noon after a hook when Jean who had been helping Mrs. Piffers with the dinner came home with me.

Thursday 18

Dan went trucking at 7⁰⁰ a.m. in the morning so Mr. Barker and I got in three loads of oats ourselves and Jean pitched back a load for us. Drove in with two teams again after dinner and got ten more loads stowed away in the dry. There were 18 loads from the competition field.

Friday 19

Spent the day over at Piffers helping draw in grain. I loaded and drove the team all day when we got in 7 loads of rye, 3 loads wheat, and five loads of oats putting our neighbours harvest in pretty good shape. Dan & I got in a load of oats when we came home so we had supper at five.
