1887

Pete and I got in a couple of loads of straw this forenoon into the horse stable. He has been splitting wood this afternoon while I went out to Dover. Called to see Mr. Clarke on the way out and Mr. Schinger also. Went to James Holcomb's on the way home, to see about matters respecting my late sister's will.

It is really cold weather still, and snow is increasing almost constantly.

JANUARY

WEDNESDAY 19

1887

Have had a very rough day of it so far. A strong South West wind has been blowing and drifting the snow terribly. Drove up to Lincoln however ~~to~~ and took William Katts with me to look after a matter at the Bank. Got along nicely. Came home by horse and took dinner at Williams. Had considerable difficulty in getting through power snow drifts this morning; but our colt George goes along nobly through anything, almost.
