helped us un-load them. There were ten of them
all the lambs we have left now are the six ewe
lambs that we are going to keep. It was about
noon when we got home and we did chores this afternoon.

Thursday December 22nd

I went down this morning to replenish our feed
supply with a load of coal as George's horse
sent word over the other day that we had better
get down soon and take the load of chestnut he
promised Dad. to save for him. Dad started down
with me but we met Billy Mills so Dad had
to return with him. Joe weighed the wagon and
informed me that I couldn't get any chestnut
coal so I put on a load of stone. I went up to Aunt
and waited for Dad. who walked down and got a
stick at the Wide spread to make a stave in
the cow stable to replace the one Cnocferna broke
when she nearly finished Dad. We hauled up a
small bag of corn stalks this afternoon. Dad and
Enoch went down to choir practice to night.

Friday December 23rd

We were late getting around this morning as
indeed we have been for the last few weeks
and I had just time enough to go down to the mill
and get some chicken feed and low grade of beer.
