- 6 Fine day, in morning then turned cold
- 7 Shanty day. Mrs. Redgum paid 3.00 quarters for the month of Jan. To 1 kind of beef 95 lbs 6.00 per lb. 5.75
- 8 Wednesday. Fine bright day. I sent a letter to Annie. And I called at the Manse, and got a cup of cocoa & a good piece of cake. Heard that Robbie Watson died and George will be down tonight with the remains
- 9 Donald Watson is coming tonight. I was out and sold 12 doz eggs at Hillies 30.00 per doz rice 25. nutmeg 5.1 lb sulphur 5.1 lb soda 5 molasses 11.00. Called at Miss M. Kenzie
- 10 Snowing & blustering. Kandy came tonight. Neal & Lizzie Watson came tonight
- 11 Charlie McDonnell died yesterday after a few hours illness. They sent to Manse for a specialist, but he died before

- 12 Stormy day, not many in church. Charles McDonald buried today, a large funeral
- 13 Kandy left this forenoon for Kingston. Still cold & stormy
- 14 St. Valentines day. I got nothing
- 15 Storm has ceased
- 16 Fine day. To 1 pan bread 24. sugar 25. Paid 35 to Mundy. Kandy came in evening
- 17 Snow, drifting, not very cold. A man came to inspect the mill. He clothes Jim took him to Cameron's
- 18 Jimmie went to Lancaster to go to Cornwall. Far is coming tonight. To 2 pans of bread 48.00
- 19 Fine day, cold & bright. Farguhar did not come last night, he came this morning. I was in church for the first time since the Convention. Sold on Saturday 2 doz eggs 90.00 1 box biscuit 25 ginger 10. Molasses 62
- 20 Far left for Cornwall, in morning Jim got some for dinner. Alfred H. Robertson paid 4 dollars for two months rent
- 21 Very fine day, sunshine. first rain. The first fine day this year. There was plenty of sun since, but cold & stormy on other days, but this is fine so far 12.30
- 22 The boys drew a small load of hay, from 2d Com. with Luby & George, and a jug of wood
- 22 Kind of snow cold 1 doz eggs 25.00. got three set to R. B.
