Some Common Knee Affections—No. 4.

Where synovitis is late developing, and depends upon the gradual extension from a localized periostitis, or from a detached fringe of the semilunar cartilage, or from a subpatella bursitis, the strapping is merely a factor in the management of the case. It is, as we say, an adjuvant. The question of immobilization presents itself for consideration, and a posterior splint, plaster-of-Paris bandage and axillary crutches are often necessary to control the inflammatory reaction.—*Hunter; Mass. Med. Journ.*
