Hattie & Arthur over on the evening we had
a chicken for dinner she old seker griated
her head Paul killed her & I dressed her
Mon 25 cold west wind but a beautiful
day nice sunshine Will went to Port to
mill. Harpore. Hattie & Paul went after
Peaches got a basket for 25 at Franbys
Hattie got 3 for 85; 2 at 30 & one at 25; took 4 1/2
of butter @ 24 path got 50 worth of sugar 99
box of hair pins. Arthur threshing at Ed Wells
I picked a hen for dinner but she was so
fat I put her on Hall & water until tomorrow
I churned & worked the butter, boiled the
last of our meat for dinner. terribly cold
& frosty tonight. Will brought us 75 lb of

of flour I doubled the crop of ^{ground} flour first day of Stanford 53
hair. I am in the miller girls over to the other
house Harpore gave us a calf. Harpore washed the
cows so Paul could go to work. she had things
I put the hen on to boil the first thing. Harpore
fixing her hat over. I pealed 3 3/4 of small turn
Arthur went ^{to} Kirkby for his colts. we had him
over to see Lucy she has a sore foot. Harpore
poulticed it with carrots & then put bran on
at night ^{she} went on so she had to take it off
frost on the forepart of the night burned warm
she hardest frost we have had last night
Wed 27 looked like rain on the farm when
Hattie & her mother went to Chippawa. Hattie
got a letter from her uncle Biller. Arthur
said he 24 on Chippawa after Paul guarded
the cows he went to Newton to cut marsh grass
& guarded the cows on the afternoon. Harpore
cut the clover in the school house field. Harpore
still at her hat. I dug some potatoes on the
forenoon pretty hot. but a cool wind if it was
not for that it would be awful hot. poor Clyde
don't seem any better. Harpore is poulticing
Lucy's foot with bran until tomorrow. Kirkby will
bring a wash. Ross has great curiosity to know what
is on Lucy's foot
Thurs 28. Kirkby came before dinner says his fever is
so high that it depends on it going down if he
