 got in May \$4.25 paid Nichols for new tone part 425
 got 40¢ paid to M. Hardy. Willie got ram 40
 490 value at station from Belt with 18¢ express. 25
 Willie did odd jobs fixed binder canvass etc.
 drove sick sow also saw with 3 pigs back to
 sand hill pea field to get peas off stubble.

22 Fine s Saturday
 Fine sunny day. Willie at Maywoods
 thrashing a m I plowed and harrowed No 6
 barn field sod. P.M. Willie spread stocks
 in No 2 and we hauled them in 4 loads then
 finishing the field they were not quite dry some of them
 May turned out some of the wet stocks in No 3A
 I stacked them up again at night. Willie came
 town in evening got pair boots for me \$3.50 350
 bread 70¢ 12 its (Willie paid boots with cheque R.B.) 12

23 Sunday
 Fine day sunny and cloudy thunder and
 lightning around the horizon in evening. I
 422 stayed at home a m. Dr. Hay preached a m from
 "The summer is ended and we are not saved" and in
 evening from Joel 2: 28. Ch coll 50 L d 10 60

24 Monday
 Fine sunny cool day. A.D. up all day pulling
 flax. we put load wood on waggon (grand box)
 2265 Willie took it down home then went to station got
 the tanks of coal oil from Columbus to gave cheque J.B. 16.00 1300
 got at Stab rape seed 25 tomatoes 35 at Nichols tanks 5 35 30
 We cut half of oats in No 4 also took in 2 loads oats from No 3A. pro 300 600

1088 6 24 began brought his bag at night. Paid Arthur Walker \$6.00 cheque J.B. 16.00 1689 89 249 33 741 57 9777
