

Tues day January 4th

Didn't get around very early this morning and spent most of the forenoon doing chores and putting a latch on the north storm door... and this afternoon I didn't get much of anything done. Supper came along with a load of implements he was taking up to his farm 16 miles west of Srinco and he came in and got 3 cockles from me and promised to bring me some buckwheat the next time he comes down. I put the boards from the floor in the chicken pen but didn't get it put together. I did the Chores up before dark and to night I went home as she was there washing 3 days. Windy, very mild.

Wednesday January 5th

We were very late this morning getting up so I didn't do much but chores before noon. I levelled off the hay in the mow as Dad told me he would send Dick Long out with another load to-day and they came this afternoon. It snowed quite hard for an hour or so about noon so I got the cutter cleaned up as well as I could. The chickens have got it in a bad mess and taken the back of the seat. Ina came up at noon and as soon as the Long left. I hooked up to the cutter

and drove Mary down to Junties and Ina stayed with the kids. Aunty Alice was having a bridge party and invited Mary in for the refreshment end of it. I left her there and Roy and I drove over to the farm where I got a bag of wheat. We went back to Aunty about six and I had my tea there so it must have been after seven when we got home and I then drove Ina home. Mild all day but colder to night.

Thursday January 6th

I spent all the time I had when I wasn't doing chores working at the chicken pen and got the east door hung and the wire along the front and got started to make the roosting. Supper was in this afternoon and brought me five bushels of buckwheat. He said he would be back and get some old hens from me. Mahel came over after school and by is staying all night. She & Mary are arranging about having Sunday school started over here. I went out after tea and sorted out my pullets from the cockles and put them in the new pen and left the cockles in the Colony house. I counted 114 pullets and 32 cockles which with the chickens I have killed & sold makes about \$25.00 out of the 400 raised. Cloudy, colder & rather blustering.
