

May 21st 1873.

- Sun 21. Beautiful day, fine ^{wind} blowing, quite hard from the SW.
- Mon 22. Lovely day, mild warm and growing day, farmers taking advantage of the nice weather, many of them not having ^{rain} any snow yet.
- Tue 23. Very warm day, but cloudy up till 3:30 P.M., when a most terrific Thunder Storm came up, the rain that fell for the time, has never before seen its ~~parallel~~ equal and I never remember of the wind blowing so hard, while the storm lasted it was almost impossible to see without a light, so black was the cloud and heavy the rain.
- Wed 24. Queen's Birth day, very cold and windy, but lovely and bright. Miss Hoppins Teacher missed her chance to Kingston, consequently had to walk

May 25th 1873.

- Thurs 25. Fine and warm, a light dash of rain about noon, but of little account.
- Fri 26. Mild and partly cloudy.
- Sat 27. Cool and cloudy, commenced raining this afternoon, but did not amount to much, a heavy fog this evening.
- Sun 28. Lovely today quite windy most of the day, attended Church this evening Rev. Mr. Campbell in the pulpit. He preached a good sermon and perhaps his last here, a lovely moon light night.
- Mon 29. Most beautiful day and lovely at night. Billy Clark came to learn Chess playing today.
