To 1<sup>st</sup> Post of Westley 10 Salts 10 Pictures in Lancaster  
Tyo's House and of Mr Charles Tyos I aimed the Rock high Wind  
Coming home took dinner at Lukes stopped on Aleses  
Island as we take in Water 26<sup>th</sup> Putting in 1<sup>st</sup> Cal  
Cooked in house flowers 27<sup>th</sup> Mowing St Joseph  
of Armentheas Day Warm 28 Mowing Thunder Hawk  
Lightning great rain boats a going and lots of  
Boats just before 1<sup>st</sup> Cal Jackson rocks and its very  
rainy those days lots of Jackson rocks and its very  
early for them to flock down Gordon Douglass  
Arrived to Day at 11<sup>th</sup> Plattsboror 29<sup>th</sup>  
Marie White came to Day taking an odd step  
of Potatoes 30<sup>th</sup> Garfield and Moore collected here  
got 50 cents for cooking for them I assisted and  
Mrs M. Douglass and Miss Caty & Mr Douglass  
here 31<sup>st</sup> Arrived at 1<sup>st</sup> Cal Ontario Day  
The Cow calved first day by some one else & Mrs  
Anne Douglass and Jane Douglass Anne Douglass  
and Elizabeth Chesholm here put out  
the duck of timber 3<sup>rd</sup> Marie wife and  
Boys went up to Montreal Francis her  
she with 1<sup>st</sup> basket 2<sup>nd</sup> basket Butterflies  
flowers 5<sup>th</sup> very warm Birds here for a  
long time that gracieuse took up for him 6<sup>th</sup>  
Randolph Keith Day 18<sup>th</sup> A very very very

Morning 9<sup>th</sup> at 1<sup>st</sup> Cal 10<sup>th</sup> Mr. Morris & Hopkins  
here I upping it to crooked to Liss... we took  
over 1<sup>st</sup> of September 4<sup>th</sup> Dollars to my account  
Bought Lemay Thread Sea Rat R.R. Stone Fork Rake  
Sawtooth I bought an in Ward oil Hops Claves Brown  
Worm Candy Face paid me Ward this to 5<sup>th</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> of 1882  
Windy Rainy day Stop at Hammon  
Rode down south Tom at the light house  
and Peter with the train 12<sup>th</sup> Morning Wood May  
and Indian here 13<sup>th</sup> Bright & Baskets from  
his girl Blanche & Muller here taking  
Winsky 1.3. Mr. Gene here brought me 2 or  
3 lbs of Tea and 2 lbs of Barley Gordon and  
Dinner & Rose here took his pants to be made  
14<sup>th</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> men fishing that came up with the men  
15<sup>th</sup> Mowing 16<sup>th</sup> Top those men went off 17<sup>th</sup>  
Rained very very hard windy cold 18<sup>th</sup>  
finished mowing lower Point & in  
cold & not well got a Channel Cat from  
Philips Gathering 19<sup>th</sup> Mr. John Morris came  
up with his 2<sup>nd</sup> boy Burds got his lines  
all 20<sup>th</sup> Bldmire's Birth Day 1870  
Mr. David Baker here and Robinson stop  
all night 20<sup>th</sup> Mr. Baker went off mowing  
here corn good to eat 21<sup>st</sup> Went north  
the Morris and Marcelline over to trash  
he went to Dundee took the road and  
came back by boat Roselle put him  
over to Morris 22<sup>nd</sup> Mr. Morris Phillips  
and Cropped to 4<sup>th</sup> Baker met Mr. Baker  
at breakfast on the small island  
out of Morris & Baker and a dog of good  
trifling bus came home morning 23<sup>rd</sup> Mr. Morris  
and Phillips and I went to 3<sup>rd</sup> New in  
a boat Middle Mr. Lauren Wagnant  
let there go pairing they promised to come  
to us but did not come
