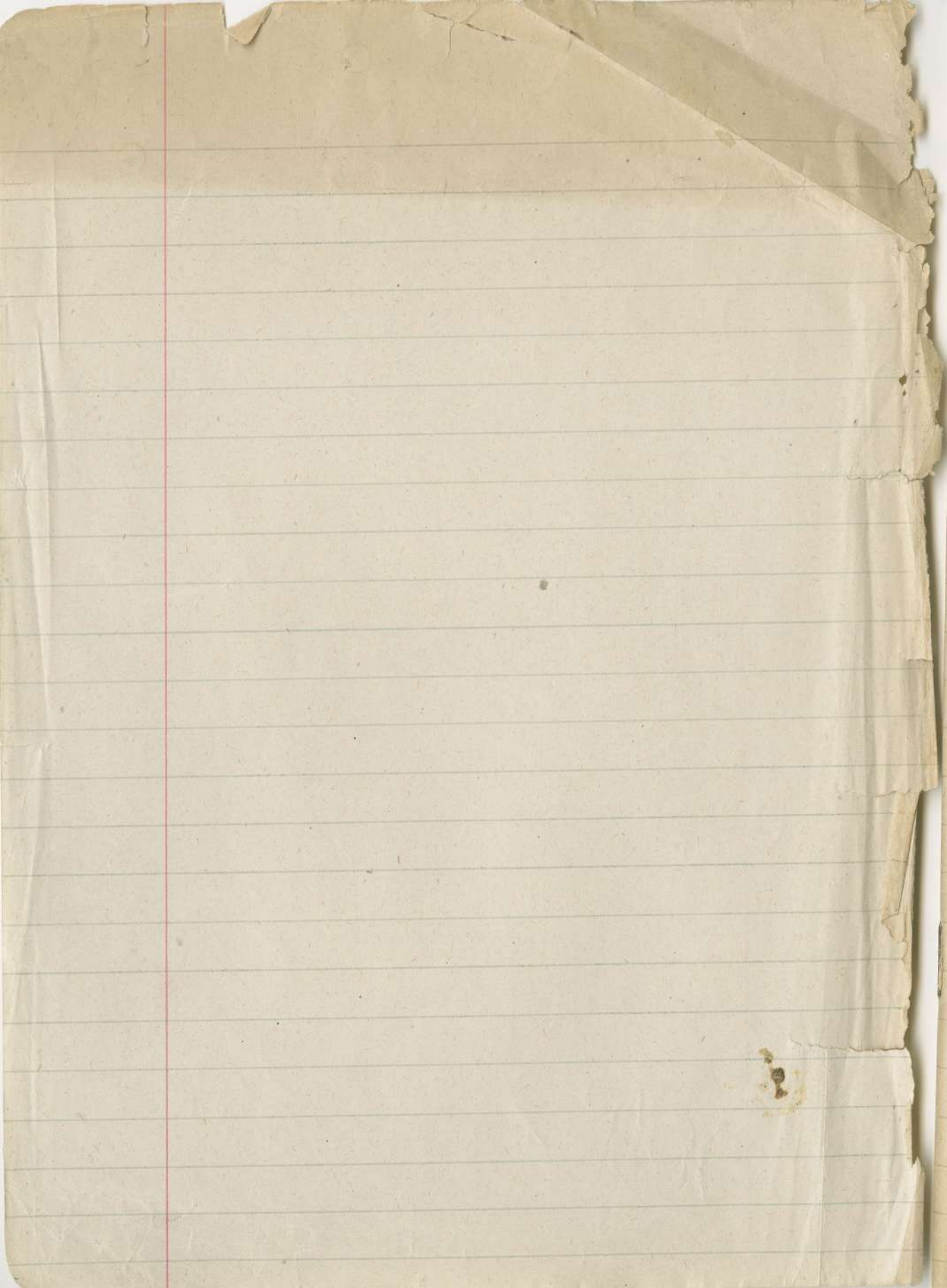

1921- March 29th - August 21st -

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Tuesday Cold but warming up - nice sunshine.
March 29th - Wrote some letters for Charles. Wrote an
account of Mr. Moore's lecture on Inexpen-
sive Flower Gardens and trees for
Enterprise - Mrs. Beattie supplying the
part on roses. Went down to the office
to make the entries and while down
went to the sample room at McDonald
House to get a hat. Went down there
again after tea with Donny and
called at Public Library coming back.
Did some more letters for Charles after
dinner. Donny went to a party at
Pearl Buckley's & Julius to the office to
register voters for the Referendum.

Wednesday Wrote a long letter for Julius. Went -
March 30th - down town for breakfast. Did some mending.
Wrote another letter for Julius after
dinner. Went to dressmaker's with
Donny and then we went up to call
on Mother; after tea called at Rich's
& Abeau's to invite them to a euchre
party to-morrow night - Duncan up in the
evening.

Thursday
March 31st

Went down town in the morning to make purchases for Easter party at night. A letter from Adelaide arrived saying that Frank was seriously ill (hemorrhage on Easter Sunday or Tuesday before) but the doctors thought not in immediate danger but he was to be taken to the hospital & she would write if he were worse. In the afternoon a woman came asking Charlie to come if possible so Julius and Charles decided to go. So I called off my party. Phoned everybody but Richie and called there. Then went to the office to help Julius get ready. Mr. Caldwell and I worked until 11 p.m. I went at 10 to Halladay's bridge party where telegram arrived. She went to Bijou in the evening with Mrs. McDonald as nobody was at home.

Friday
April 1st

Worked at office all morning. Packed Julius' suit case. He and Charlie drove to Hanover, leaving here at

2.30 p.m. and caught C.P.R. train. Went
to Litch's to get Huxley's peppermints for
Jack and called on Mrs. Litch. Then
went up to see Mother and wish Jack
"many happy returns of the day." Mrs.
Ferguson called in the evening and
stayed until 10 p.m. Dorothy at home
all evening.

Saturday Beautiful spring day. Did Dorothy's
April 2nd last-minute shopping. Went down
town in the morning to get her American
money etc. Went down with Dorothy after
dinner to do her last-minute
shopping. Mrs. McDonald, Vi Mac
and Pearl Buckley were here playing
bridge. Mrs. Maxwell called to see
me. After tea went to Public Library
& then to office to see if I could help
Mr. Caldwell (registering voters for
Referendum) Then went to the Station
and bought Dorothy's the Ticket "Toronto
via Windsor".

Sunday Warm day. Dorthy and I went to church
April 3rd in the morning. Just about an hour
before S. S. Dorthy discovered she had
corks in her hair (Sovereign of Settlement
I expect) so I combed it and had to
rush in S. S. Dr Mer-Came up after
church. After S. S. I went to Leitch's
for remedies. Mrs. Beattie came over
to see brother. Then Mr. & Mrs. M. A.
called and Mrs. Stewart-Came to
the door. Dr Mer-stayed for tea. Then
I washed Dorthy's hair and went
over it again. Went to Lorey's to see
if there was any message from
Prince-Albert. None. Went up home
with brother and called to see Mr.
Kyle who is very ill. (Somewhat-
better.) Cool enough for my fur coat-
at night. Helped Dorthy pack & got-
to bed at midnight.

Monday Very warm day. Mrs. Ryce and
April 4th I took the furniture out of the drawing
room. Paper hangers gave the ceiling

one coat-of-paint. Went down town
for meat. Wrote to Ellen Gable en-
closing Dan's cheque. (Forgot to say
I got up at 5:30 a.m. and went to
station with Dan. Leaving for Detroit
for visit with - Harry Bull and then
going straight from there to Detroit.)
and to Miss McKaughan for Mrs.
McGregor. Went down town for meat.
Went down in the afternoon for mail
and went around to Mrs. Ferguson's
to deliver a letter from Bert Halliday
enclosed in one to me. Saw Mrs.
Beattie, who came over with me
and we discussed flowers & flower
seeds. After tea wrote to Mrs.
Mulligan and to Julius.

Tuesday April 5th Mrs. Beattie came over in the morning &
we spent an hour or more arranging
flowers for my perennial borders. After-
dinner I went over there to complete
list of plants & seeds. Mrs. Mann called.
Went down town for mail. Wrote part of

leaves of Tulips & Mrs. Ryan finished
the job. Went over to see Mrs. Harper
but someone there so did not go in.
Wrote to Julius & Dorothy & went to
station to post my letters. Alice got
telegram from Charlie saying "Frank
improving". Doctors think he may come
round. "Very hot. Too hot for work".

Wednesday Very hot day. Mr. Vickers finished
April 6th drawing room ceiling. Went down
luncheon after dinner for mail. Went up
to see Mother and called to see Mr.
Kyle. Went to Mrs. Beattie's to deliver
a plant - Mother gave me for her but
found her out. Discussed fence with
Mr. Lipscomb. Gathered some cress &
sowed for Mrs. Jones & took it down
to her. After tea went to see Mrs.
Harper. Wrote to Julius & Clara
and went to the station to post my
letters. Typed an extract for letters
to Julius.

Thursday Very hot day. Mr. Vickers finished
April 7th - drawing room all but one lining strip of
border. Went down town in the
morning for break. Was out in garden
telling Tommy Ryan what to do.
Called on Mrs. Conrad King (who was ill).
In morning went down to Mrs. Beattie's
to see about some plants and went
to see Mrs. David Irvine, who was worse
and was in bed. After coming home
went down to get some pins to put
up pictures. Got 2 letters and 2 post-
cards from Julius - 1st letter en route.
Other letter and cards from Regina
but no word from Dorothy. Wrote to
Julius and took letter to the station.
Sent a wire to Marion Bull.

Friday Homecleaning all day. Put up all the
April 8th - pictures, put up drape above arch etc.
Went down town for the mail. Letter from
Dorothy. Mrs. M. A. Halliday called and
Duncan came up with - as usual.
Wrote to Julius and Duncan posted
my letter. Made out the Quarterly Report

for the Church School and fixed
cards for Primary class. G.A. letter
from Dorothy. Wrote Tuesday postmarked
Detroit on Thursday. G.A. here Friday at noon.
Saturday
April 9th Washed the piano, all the dishes on
plate-rail and on Buffet, also the
electric lights & shades in dining
room & drawing room. Went down
for the mail after-dinner and after-
tea went to Library - helped Mrs.
Ferguson until 9 p.m., went to
Lustig's for meat & to bridge for a
walk. Had a wire from Dorothy
this morning.

Sunday
April 10th Cold day - wore my fur coat. Went
to Church twice & to S.S. (Church in the
morning & in service in the
Evangelical Church - at night service
in our church as Mr. Keller -
man is in quarantine with Ellen
who has scarlet fever. Mrs. Kellerman
at Green's with new baby daughter.)
Went to see Mrs. Hoppe in the
afternoon and after church at

Met Mrs. Ferguson and I went up
to see mother and on the way home
I called and had my throat checked
at Dr. Rennie's. Nell telephoned that
she had a wire from Julius saying
Monday Frank was better and now on the
way to recovery.

Monday Still cool but a little warmer.
Apr. 11th - Cleaned books in library - Electric
lights etc. In fact - busy house -
cleaning until after 4 o'clock
when I went down for the mail.
a crown came off so I went up
to Dr. Caulfield's to get it on. Wrote
to Julius. Went to Public Library
Board meeting and afterwards
walked to bridge & back with
Mrs. Ferguson.

Tuesday Fine day. Typed a four (long) page
April 12th letter for Mrs. Ferguson for L. M. S. Society.
Took it over to her and called to see
Mrs. Beattie about seeds etc. Wrote

to Donny and Margaret Smith. Went
down town for the mail. Went up to
see mother and called to see Mr.
Kyle. Did some shopping on the
way home and after tea went to
Post Office to see if there was any
letter from Charles in the north mail.
Called to take some roses to Mrs.
Hopper and then called to see Mr.
& Mrs. M. A. Halliday as they got
word to-day that Mr. James Halliday
was dead. (M. A. mth-) Wrote to Charles
and went to the station to post the
letter.

Wednesday Beautiful day. Washed my hair.
April 13th Wrote to Blanche Gillies and aunt
Anansi. Went down town for the
mail and brought it home. Called at
the maase and then went to see
Mrs. Leslie. Went down to shore for
curtains for hall door. After tea
wrote to Charles, Nell and Jean Hyde.
Went down to post office to post my letters.

Met Mrs. Maywell and Mrs. Rogers. Mrs. Maywell had been coming to see me because she had heard that Frank had died. Chatted with Mr. James Halliday. Housecleaning finished.

Thursday
April 14th Fine in the morning. I gathered some stones off the road and prepared boxes as miniature hot beds for my snap-dragon and ageratum seeds and then planted them. Wrote to Beth Halliday. Went to the office for the mail and then to Johnston's for lesson on electricity. Called on Mrs. Leitch. After tea wrote to Charles and Nell and attended the Referendum meeting which was addressed by Mr. Pitkin of Lower Sound. Mr. M. A. Chasman & Edmund Minister and Mr. McCausland and Mr. McLachlan on the platform. Mrs. Jones not present at meeting. Rained quite heavily from about 5-5 7 p.m.

Friday
April 15th Cool day. Went down at noon for mail. Had a wire from John's from

Regina saying Frank is steadily
improving and they will be in Dorchester
Sunday and home Monday in time
to vote on the Referendum. Rany
told us and discovered that Donkey
had not turned up in Dorchester. Well
telephoned in evening to say that Donkey
Nickle had a letter from her saying
she would be there this week. Went up
to see Mother; called to enquire for
Mr. Kyle, Went in to see Mrs. Leitch
and then went to enquire for Mrs.
Innes. As she wanted to see me I
went in. She is very very ill. Duncan
was up in the evening. I wrote to
Mrs. Linton, Mrs. Blair and Mrs. Small.

Saturday
April 16th Cold and stormy. Quite a lot of snow
fell. Was out at 8 a.m. to show Mr.
Phillips what to do in the garden but
he could only work a short time as
the weather got bad. Went to the
Office after dinner and did all the
entries Mr. Caldwell has made since

Julius went away. Called at Public Library for some books. Vi Trani and Mr. Caldwell called after tea to get books. Wrote to Dorothy, Mrs. Gorden and Mrs. Luthell.

Saturday Cold. Sidewalks icy. Julius and I
April 17th - Shivering up through the snow and took very poor. Went to church twice and to S. S. Mr. Iner preached on prohibition at night and it was 9 p.m. when we got out of church. Called on Mrs. Hopper after S. S. and after church at night - wrote to Gertrude Cass in Korea and Irene Frazer.

Sunday Another birthday. Went down town for
April 18th - heat. At noon Alice Jean brought me a bowl she had made me for my birthday. Voted on the Referendum in the morning. Mrs. Hopper dressed and walked down to Wark's and voted. Studied my recitation. Went to afternoon hair to meet Julius and Charlie. After Julius

Had voted went-down town with
him. After-tea Julius and I went
up to see Mother. Mr. Lewis seemed
very much discomfited. General
Judgment-being that he did not
state where he stood and did
Larue rather than good. He gave
Mr. Dawey some nasty publicity
about Taulas which was not-only
undeserved but-very injudicious.
Alice & Charlie gave me a box of chocolates and
Julius gave me \$25 to buy my own birthday gift.

Tuesday Tipped out - "How Life Held the Road"
April 19th in Myrtle Safana. Went-down town
for meat. Made to Nell Frank and
Mr. Jarney. At 2.30 p.m. Dr.
Rammie, Mrs Ferguson and I
went to the McDonald house to
select books for the Public Library.
Afterwards I went for a walk with
Mrs. Ferguson & Mrs. M. A. Halliday.
After tea Julius and I went up to
see Mr. Kyle and on the way home
joined Charlie and family in the
orchard where they had a big bonfire.

Wednesday Wrote some letters for Charles. Went to
April 20th the Bank with the S. S. Collection.

Rained after dinner. Wrote to Clara,
Dorothy, Nimmie Ferguson and Mrs.
McEachern. Rained cleared up. Went
down town to Charlie's store to look
for curtains. (Charlie not in) I met
Mrs. Ferguson and we went out to
McManus' Corner for a walk. When we
got back to Davy's corner Mrs. Ferguson
went home but I went on to the top
of the hill and made it 2 1/2 miles.
First long walk for some time so
felt tired to night. Julius went to
the McDonald House to call on
the High School Inspector.

Thursday Showery. Got box ready and planted
April 21st some more Snapdragon seed. Mr.

McDonald and his men to take off the
double windows, put up wire on tennis
court; fix fence, gate, doors, etc. Busy
seeing that screens are right etc. Went
down town for mail. Studied Recitation.

Myrtle phoned not to come until to-
morrow. Spent the afternoon preparing
exam. papers (conundrums) for my
School party on Tuesday night.
(School teachers and a few others I want
to entertain.) Wrote to Dorothy to
thank her for a couple of books.
"Tales of Three Hemispheres" and
"The Seeds of Enchantment" which she
sent me for my birthday. Charles
went to Masonic meeting. Thunder
storm in the evening.

Friday Raining nearly all day. Reviewed my
April 22nd recitations. Went to Mrs. Beattie's to see
what roses to order for our hedge.
After-dinner (at 2 p.m.) went to
Johnston's for my Christmas lesson. Then
went down lawn and afterwards came
home and went back again. John's
went to Charlie's store with me to look
for canaries. After tea began work
on my new recitation. Dinner here.
Worked at my hay cloth for an hour in the
morning.

Saturday Still Showery. Mended stockings, learned
Apr. 23rd. recitation (part) measured curtains, Went
down to the office to get some work - Wrote
1 letter - and 11 circular letters (2 at once).
for Julius. Went to Recital at Almas
where I presented her prizes. Then went
for a walk with Mrs. Miller whom I
met on the street at Town Hall. After
tea Julius went down to Groves,
(Mrs. Groves died this morning) and
I went to the Public Library where
I helped Mrs. Ferguson until she
closed up and then we went down
town to do some shopping.

Sunday ~~Raining in morning~~. Beautiful warm
Apr. 24th day. Went to Church, Evangelical in the
morning and ours at night. Went to
S. S. Mother came up after Church
and stayed until S. S. time. Called
on Mrs. Hopper (Charles and I) after S. S.
at church at night. Mrs. Ince took exception
to Mr. McDonald's talk in the Enterprise
connecting him with the "4 ministers"

who did not give weight of influence
to help Referendum. Also announced
that he would go as soon as he got
a call. Julius and Charlie went
to the maase to see him after church
and Alice and I came in home
then the men joined us later.

Monday. Beautiful day. Wrote a letter for
April 26th - Julius & studied some history. Wrote
to Lillian Epler, Dorothy, Frank &
Margaret - Smith. Charles Julius
went to Mrs. Lennie's funeral and
acted as pall-bearer. Went down to
post letters and to pay some bills.
Wrote to Clara, took it down to post &
walked to Dawson's for Julius' laundry.
Took it back to office and then went
to the top of North Hill for a walk. After-
tea Mr. J. E. Campbell spent the
evening until late train. Sat outside
on Veranda, very warm, went to
late train with Mrs. Jew & met Mrs.
Smith and carried her suit case to

The house went in for a few minutes.

Tuesday Very hot day. Discussed with Mr. Lipsell
April 26th rose hedge &c. Studied recitation. Typed
Income Tax Returns (3 separately) for
Julius. After dinner went down town
and had a walk with Mrs. Evans.
Mrs. Hyper called me (was out at the
back) and I went over to see her. In
the afternoon called at Mrs. Biehn's
to invite her to postponed euchre party. Also
^{at Mrs. Beattie's.} (Telephoned the others) after tea Mr. Arnold
called and took me for a drive in his
car. Then Julius and I went up to
see Mr. Kyle and called at Charlie's
on way home. Had riddles with
children.

Wednesday Raining ^{in the afternoon.} Wrote a couple of letters for
April 27th Julius. Went down town in the morning
to do some shopping for euchre party
at night. Called at Mrs. Beattie's. Plants
arrived from Horticultural Society. After
dinner dusted Dorothy's room and spare

room, helped get-out-dishes bring
down tables, arranged flowers etc. Then
went-down home for lawn etc. at-
party. (Postponed on account of Frank's
illness.) Mr. & Mrs. Caldwell, Mr. & Mrs.
Reid, Mrs. Litch (Mr. Litch away.) Dr.
& Mrs. Tracy, Mrs. Biehn, Mrs. Sofana,
Charlie, Alice, Grace Steven, Mr. &
Mrs. Coburn, Mr. & Mrs. Beattie. (Mr.
Biehn & Mrs. Litch away who were to be
at other party and Alice & Grace took
their places.) Had a nice time.

Thursday Beautiful day. Mrs. Beattie was here
April 28th in the morning and we planned
out-flowers etc. Then I went-down
there to return her cards. Planted
my pink and blue border. Went
to Johnston's at 3 o'clock for my
evening letter. Called at - Crow's,
Hilson's, McDonald's, Sanders's,
Daver's and at - Olive & Mabel's
Evans and at - Hilson's to invite Mrs.
Millar to a party to-morrow night.

Mr. Seari was here for tea. I superintended
Mr. Phillips who planted my yellow
and purple border. Wrote to Clara
and Dorothy.

Friday Rained all day and in evening. Busy in
April 29th - The morning selecting the questions for
examination papers for party. Went down
town to do some shopping. After dinner
typed the exam. papers. Helped make the
sandwiches (had to go down town for more
buns) and fix up boxes (trunks) and
paper them up for my school party.
Dried flowers and got tea and ready
for guests. Present: - Mr. & Mrs. Wilson
(H. S. Principal) Mrs. Millar & Miss
Evans (of H. S. Staff) (Mrs. McCallum
away for week-end) Mrs. Litch (Mr. L
away) and Mrs. Cox, Charlie and
Albie, Mr. & Mrs. Sanderson, Mr. & Mrs.
Dacey, Mr. & Mrs. McDonald, Mr. & Mrs.
McNeil, and Mrs. Beattie came to help
me. Had Chocolate bars (9 kinds 2¢
each) for selecting partners. 94 and Mrs

a success and everybody had a
good time. Alice and Mrs. Wilson
won 1st prize (Box of Lemon and
raspberry drops and a note book) and
Mrs. French and Mrs. Sanderson the
Cubby (scribbling books.)

Saturday Much cooler 15-day. Still cloudy. Darned
April 30th my stockings, Went down town for meat.
Duncan was up. Lily Brown leaves
15-day as she is not a success in
the office. Went to the office in the
afternoon. After tea called at the
house to see Mrs. Smith. Who goes
back to Joints on Monday morning
& then went down to Public Library
to change some books and stayed
to help Mrs. Ferguson until closing
time.

Sunday Quite Cold. Was wishing I had not
May 1st. put my fur coat away. Went to
Church twice and to S.S. Called to
see Mrs. Harper after S.S. and family

her up. After church Charlie and Alice were up for awhile.

Monday
May 2nd Went to the office. Did up "Life & W. J. Dennis" at noon. Still cold. Spent the ^{afternoon} in the office but called at the museum on the way down. In the evening wrote to Frank, Nell, Miss Ward and Douglas Hickle (to send him recipe for Bakerwell pudding.)

Tuesday
May 3rd Went to the office and had a satisfactory day's work. After tea went to the Red Cross meeting in the Council Chamber to hear Miss Clayton's address on Health Campaign of Red Cross. Went from there to Coddell's banquet, 196 at tables. Frenchman played "Marseillaise" on Cornet. Good programme. Good eat. Charlie & Julius both spoke. Got home at midnight.

Wednesday Spent the day at the office. Went to
May 4th Miss Milne's in the morning to
select a style for my blue
tricolored dress. After tea
shampooed my hair. Cool so
had fire in the library. Planted
some hollyhocks at noon.

Thursday Spent morning at the office. Went to
May 5th to Johnston's for my elocution
lesson at 3 o'clock. Went on
dinner and got some packages.
Went to Beattie's but no one at
home. After tea spent some time
in the garden directing Mr. Phillips.
Then went to Beattie's with Lennie for
some pinks, Delphiniums, and
Sweet-William. Afterwards wrote
to Clara, Denny and Frank.

Friday Spent the day at the office. After
May 6th tea went to Miss Mearns's Recital
in the Methodist Church basement.
Then went from there to the Band
Concert where Julius was chairman.

Saturday Fine day but still cool. Was at office
May 7th all day. Went down in the morning
for meat and took it home. After tea
Went up to see Mr. Kyle - found him
sitting up in the dining room - then
called at Mr. Thies, Mr. Thies just going
to bed & only Isabel and Frances
at home. At noon went to Mrs.
Beattie's to see her about some seeds -
no one there so went to barn where
I found her.

Sunday Nice day but cool. Went to church twice
May 8th and to S. S. Went to see Mrs. Hopper
after S. S.; found her suffering a
good deal of pain. Adjutant Martin
arrived about 6.30. He went to church
with us. Then we went over to the
Town Hall where Mr. Martin gave an
address on the Work of the Salvation
Army. He came to the house afterwards
and I gave him a supper of
sandwiches & tea and he left just
after midnight & drove to London.

Monday
May 9th Went down town for meat and bought
it home - then went to the office. Called
at Beattie's at noon but no one home.
Bells came home from California on
the noon train. Spent the afternoon at
the office and after tea Charles and I
called at the Bells. Watered my seed
boxes at noon.

Tuesday
May 10th Charles had to go to Durham to Court.
Went on early train to Hanover and
drove from there to return on late
train. Spent the day at the office.
Mr. Caldwell and I cleared out
the filing cabinets. After tea went
up to see mother but she was out.
Met Charlie and Alice coming
down town so came back with
them and went to the Public
Library with Alice Jean to get
books about battles of Sumner &
Verny for history at school to-
morrow. Wednesday. Wrote to Dr. May.
Received news she sent me for
Mother's Day (Sunday). Wrote to Frank.

Wednesday Charles had to go back to Hannover on the
May 11th early train to take a case in the Gorch-
Heim. I went down for meat and
brought it home and went back for
the Globe. Nothing to do at the office.
Went to Charlie's store with a note from
Margaret and Alice to get their note on
Kenny & Sonner out of.

Thursday Went to the office in the morning.
May 12th After dinner - (had lunch at a
quarter to 12 and left at 12.) Mr &
Mrs. Beattie, Julius and I went
to Walkerton. Julius had a meeting
of Mother's Pension Board and
Mrs. Beattie and I went to Norris's
and got some plants - had ice
cream at Erdman's and went for
a walk. Came home via Hannover
and had to go around a block
to Mrs. road work. In Hannover Julius
went to see Mrs. Gross on business while
Mrs. Beattie and I tried to procure
some plants from the Horticultural

Society but no one in-charge. Got home
about 6 o'clock. Wrote to Clara, Mrs.
Beattie, Julius and I went to the
Methodist Church to hear Mrs.
Frances Michaux, the Cree Indian
Christianist - who is said to be a
Second Pauline Johnson. She was
very good indeed in her Indian
numbers and, although very homely
when dressed in her white gown, looked
quite presentable in her Indian
costume. Not yet a Pauline Johnson.
Cool - East wind - one short shower.

Friday
May 13th - Few showers to-day - Was at the
office. At 2 p.m. went to Johnston's
for my last lesson in elocution as
myrtle leaves next week. Went
from there to the office and worked
the rest of the afternoon. (Went to Mrs.
Milne's in the morning to fit my
Violette dress. After tea Mr. Lipsett,
Reginald, Julius and I planted
our rose hedge between Lipsett's and
our garden. Mrs. Beattie sent up some

phlox and a delphinium root -
which I planted and then went down
there with her pot. Found Mrs. Jeffers
there. Recited "The Pilgrims of the Plains";
"Marguerite De Roberval" "Rizpah"
"Madeline De Verchères" "Fra Giacomo"
"At Half-Mast" and "Seventy-Nine".
Went to the Station with Mrs. Beattie
to take an express parcel up and
then came home to find dinner
here as usual on Friday night.

Saturday Cool. Went for meat in the morning
May 14th which I sent up with Jamie Thomson.
Went to the office - Did a good day's work.
At noon planted some flower seeds.
After tea Mrs. Beattie came over
and we planted about half our seeds
in the back garden. Then went up
to Mother's and took up Margaret's
book as her birthday to-morrow. When
I got home so we called at Duillane's
to see Mother. Left Mrs. Beattie at
Lustig's where I got milk and bacon.

Went - to Station to meet - Margaret -
Smith. Talked some time.

Sunday Quite cold day. - Went to Church.
May 15th - Julius, Margaret and I in the morning.
Went to S. S. After P. D. went to see
Mrs. Hyman. Found her somewhat
better. Julius and Margaret went
to the Anglican Church at night and,
as I was tired, I stayed at home.
Mother came up after church and
Monday Charlie called for her in the car.

more "bricky". cleared up cold.

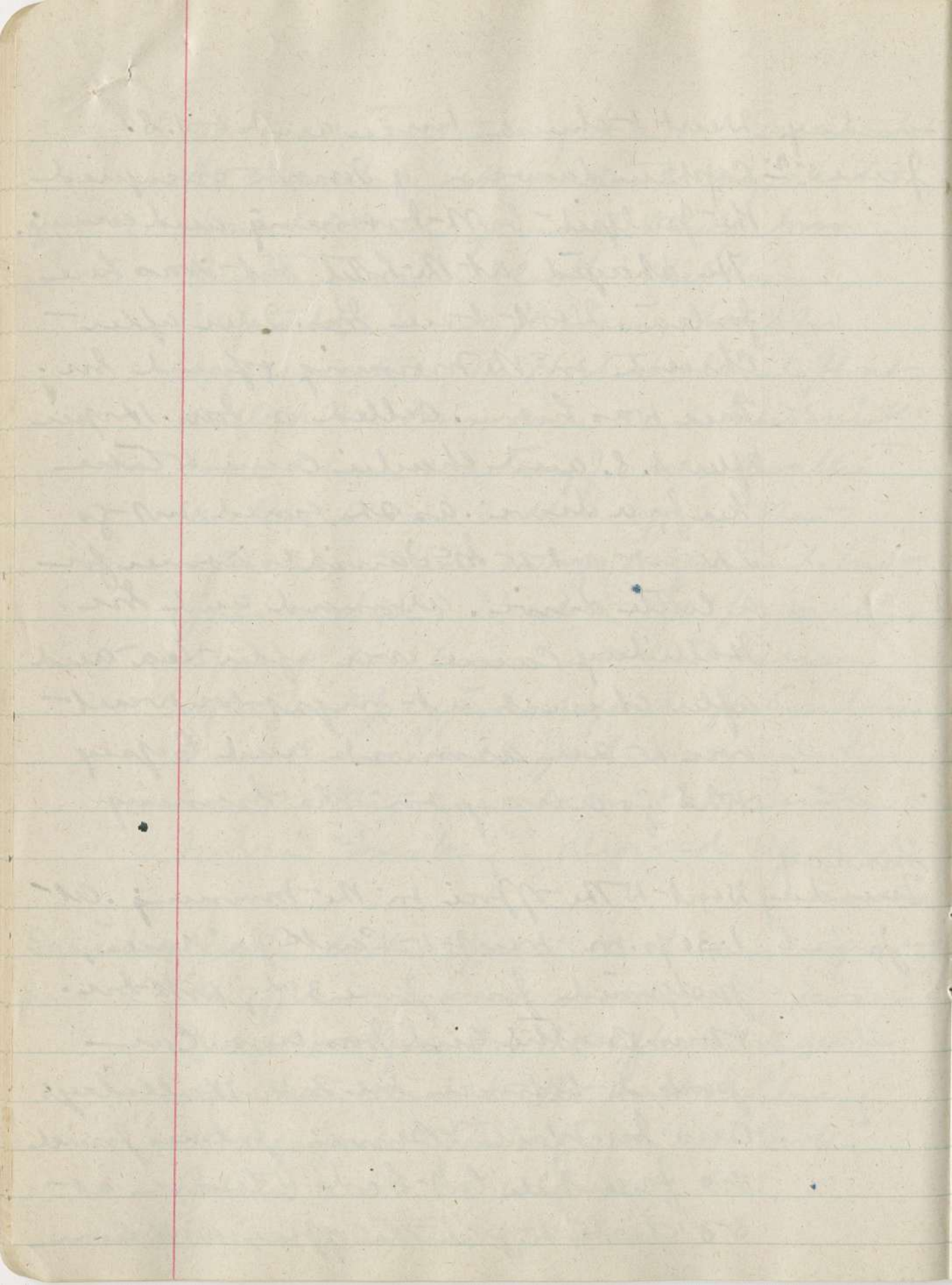

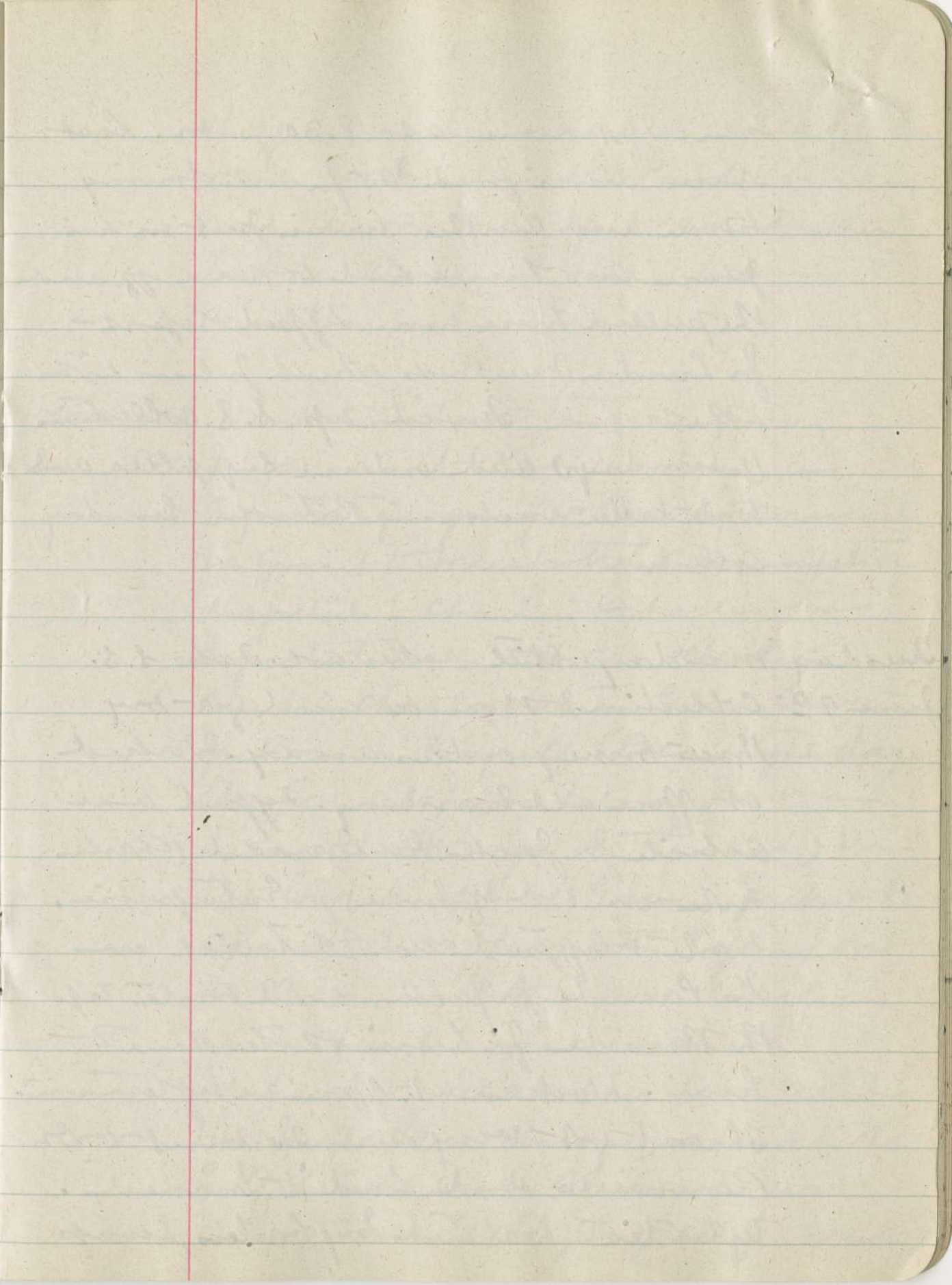

Went over to Bick's to call & met them coming to our place. Went in for a second swim. Called

at Bichin's to say good-bye to Beattie
(Mr & Mrs. & Miss) Nellie Elliot & Mrs.
Pearson. Went to the annual concert
which was held in the church on
account of the rain. Charles chairman

Friday Joe had my morning swim, Jack,
Aug. 12th Clare, Duncan, Charles and I
started for Kincardine about 10.30
a.m. to see Jack's uncle and
aunt. Broke their golf clubs along.
Had dinner at Green's, Pt. Elgin.
When reached Southampthn Charles
bumped up Mr. Malcolmson and
they went up to play golf. Clare and
I walked around the course with
them. Dined at ~~Green~~ Royal Hotel
where we put up. Then went to call
on Mr. & Mrs. J. R. Reed.

Saturday Went to golf links about 8.30 a.m.,
Aug 13th Clare & I purchased a book &
magazine respectively and sat in the
car & read. Then walked part way

Helped serve the lunch when they arrived.

Tuesday Windy still. Swim free - Alice, Keith, Duncan,
Aug. 16th Jack, Charlie, Julius, Tom, Teddy and I. Did Tom swim up. Went to W. Linton for shoes with Duncan, Clare, Baby Jack, Nell & Dong. Had a couple of walks down to the dock. Lovely moonlight - night. Charles and I had a walk on the dock while Charlie and Jack worked at the boat.

Wednesday Windy, water-cold, swim free. Clare,
Aug. 17th Teddy, Grace, Nell, Dong, Baby Jack and I went to W. Linton. Shoes closed but had some ice cream, got D's laundry and borrowed some law books from Mr. Moore. Started to rain while we were there and rained until late in the evening. Helen McCauley arrived from Southampton to see Teddy. Charlie & Jack worked at boat until 10 p.m.

Thursday Wind got up again but promises better
Aug. 18th weather to-morrow. Men trying to get boat to go so they can get away on the shore

Trip. Helped get lunch, did up his room, called at Charlie's (daily event) etc. Went down to the boat-house a couple of times and enjoyed the moonlight.

Friday
Aug. 19th.

Had my morning swim. Pretty cool. Great scurrying around to get the men away on their camping trip. As the Naidanac could not be coaxed to go Mr. Dukes took his boat with the cabin on and they took the Julland & the steel boat as trailers. Party: - Charlie, Jack, Julius, Doni Neelands, Bud, Mr. Dukes, Fred went by boat and Duncan and Zeddie drove up in the Ford to Stokes Bay and were to walk the 3 miles to Gaudy's Bay. Went to dock to see them off. They got away before 2 o'clock. Started to rain just after they left. Showery with a real rain about 3-6 and a few later showers but beautiful sunset. Dorothy & Ellie Clarke playing chess. I wrote to Mother,

Saturday

Aug. 20th

Went for a swim all by my lonesome.
Had the whole lake to myself. Wrote to
Mr. Caldwell. Clare and I walked up
to the P. O. to post the letters and also
went up later for the mail. Went in
for a swim in the afternoon with
the crowd. Nell, Alice, Grace & Dr. May
played Bridge in the evening. Nell
left, I took her place, then Ellie Clarke
took my place. I made a checker
board for Dr. May. & played a couple of
games of checkers with her.

Sunday Beautiful day. Washed my hair. dried it
Aug. 21st in Nell's balcony. All went in for a swim.
Went to church with Clare, Nell, Dr. May & Dr. May.
Mr. Marshall ^{of Miller} preached & Gladys Chambers
(now married) sang a solo. Cook in the
evening. Clare, Nell, Dr. May, Frances, Isabel,
Isabel Kestner & I sat in the kitchen by the
fire. Dr. May sailing canoeing with Ellie Clarke.
