

James Cameron Island 3rd of March 1901

Sunday Fine Day John H. there ^{John H. got a trap} Seander crossed with John H. Wrote a Letter to Tonia to come Home Rained some to night and it Blew a hard Hard Wind all night 4th a very Fine Day Thawing 2 Mocksuns one on each side of the sun and a circle around the sun Randolph here the Boys Making Basswood Bunks for the sleigh Cutting holes to Fish in the Back Bay Uncle John's Boy William Honery Shadgate's Birth Day This Oldest Son Born in Quebec When moved to New York went aboard a Frigate sailing never heard about ~~though~~ though inquired of his Father different times some Wind to night 5th an Unfortunate Day Fine Snowed Blowed cool Drifted some Fernandez went to Cornwall for Brick 4⁰⁰ to Day Snowed some to night sawed stove wood Randolph to Cornwall Bought a Bell 6th Fine commenced to Blow hard about 2.0 clock 1st Load of Logs 5th the next Load in the afternoon cut some Logs to Day Ed Renshaw and Barry passed Down on our ^{Road} Road to Lancaster for Sawdust That's 11 Logs to Day squally this afternoon 7th Fine a Steam came up passed on the south side took 6 Logs in the Forenoon 1 a small short one took 3 or 4 Boards Back Took 6 in the afternoon Took Back 250 Pieces about a 1000 Feet or over took them into the House so they would Dry Snowed quite a Bit to night East Wind 8th Unfortunate Day Gloomy not cold a few grains of snow Went with 7 Logs this Morning came Back 100 pieces 360 Feet some edgings 70 of Ash and 30 of Bitternut Turned out a very Fine Day Livinia not very Well in Bed Went this afternoon with 5 Logs heard a Crow for the first Took Back 37 Pieces 264 Feet Snowed some to night 9th Snowing Went with a Maple Log to Day got 11 Pieces out of it ^{37 pieces} For steps for the Thrashing Mill Took Back 39 ^{pieces} Feet how many Feet I Don't know 2 90 Feet Fixing ash Boards up in the Kitchen Floor up stairs so they would Dry Took over to the other House some of the Boards that was Dry and those 39 pieces Captain A. J. Baker and Mrs Baker here they look well ^{Edley to 4 Bushels of Oats} ^{7 Loads and 37 Logs} 2046 Feet

James Cameron Island 10th of March 1901

a Fortunate Day Fine East Wind cold Blowing hard Commenced Raining Rained hard all night made icicles on the Trees Ed Renshaw here Seander to church got a Sabbath school Book The Home Study 11th East Wind icicles Bending the Limbs and Trees Down and Breaking them a Song Time this Forenoon at the other House Taking up to night some Frozen Potatoes out of the cellar Windy to night 12th Unfortunate Day on This Day of the Month M. Master ^{3rd Senior} came to the Island Windy Icicles on the Trees Filled a Barrel of Water about 57 years ago the Ice opened on this Day of the Month 13th Fine East Wind Went with the Boards that they tore off the other House to get Plained and grooved to Lancaster started turned Back for what I dont know Randolph here all fishing Perch they are Breaking up the other House since I dont want them to touch it that shows the characters I have to Deal with Seander went to night to some place Windy to night 14th Stormy B Day 1880 Stormy Went to Lancaster for Sawdust Blowing drifting 15th Frosty this Morning Smoky Fernandez went to Lancaster to go to the Alexandria Meeting tomorrow Eddy and Barrie here for what I did not here drifting turned Fine & Wind They came for oats 6 Bushels for Jo Douquet got a Muskrat Fishing got a Pike 16th a very Fine Day - Conservative Meeting in Alexandria to Day Drew the cord - Wood from the Door crows flying around an Unfortunate Day sun comes out hot 3 Indians and their team taking a Load of Wood off the Little Island north side another Indian and team went Down to Suppers or Rofsn Island passed up with his Load Drew 3 Loads of Wood 17th St PATRICKS DAY Sunday Mid-Lent a very Fine Day snowed some in the afternoon Tonia and George came Randolph Eddy Fernandez John H here Fishing got 14 Perch 1 Pike Eddy took an Ice nipper here Mrs May Dunlop and Wesley's passed up to Fort Covington
