I got up at five this morning so as to be ready when Roy called and I had lots of time after I got ready to go down to the corner and get the cream can and set for seat after Ernie & Vernon had sat on what they required which was considerable. However I sat several inches on Enab's thigh and settled into place as we drove to Frank Reid's office directly but Dad. gave him a large budget of Mr. Park's
