

Electric, March 14, 1922.

I delivered mail to the Club, and round the Downline with Dick, and Kent delivered to the Bay with Oly.

David Gordon came here with 12 bags of oats containing twenty six bushels at 40 cents a bushel. I paid him $\$10.00$. Mr English went and got a load of oats - 50 bush, that he bought at Mr. Rikely's sale at fifty cents per bushel.

The day was cloudy, the roads are drying some but are still bad.

Wednesday March 15, 1922.

When I came back to Heams. Mr May from the P.O. Department was there and talked to me about mail route; I agreed to reduce my tender to $\$12.96$. English took home the rest of this oats. The day was fine and the roads are drying fast.
