Ad Sawie Bunched of Rye in South ^{East} part of
the middle field he intends to plant it next summer

5 Ad Sawie Rye Wallon & me dug
potatoes in dug 8 Baskets

6 I went to the Confirmation at the road Rev. Bierley
Levis officiated the church was full
Rev. M. Brown preached in the morning ^{at night} M. Micholson

8 Wallace & me dug 8 baskets of potatoes
Ad finished the Rye clearing out the fence

9 the Rev. M. Micholson & Mrs. Micholson come
down from Kingston we met them at the
Station & brought them hear till their house
is fixed Ad brought out part of the sawing ^{rig}

10 Ad & Wallace went out to the 9th Concession to
see his lat fine day

11 Sowed what Cordwood we had in the forenoon
we then moved the horse power to the Barn and
thorbed or rather cut a lot of peas with with the
cutting machine it did good work

12 Cleaned some peas this morning Ad took 2 1/2

^{Ad} Micholson bunched to the road he went to Kingston
^{went to his} own harness in the afternoon the intends to go to ^{at night} M. Storkes

13 I quilled in the forenoon went to a Agriculture
meeting in the afternoon

14 Rev. M. Micholson preached in the morning ^{at night} M. Galt

15 got a telegram that Ellen had a Daughter
then Mather went on the Express to Pen the
Ad got home from Kingston at night

16 Ad began to plant: Placed in South field
