In February, people were thinking they would
be moving in March, but it is keeping cold
Abrams paid P. 81 on the mortgage
I paid Murdy \$1.00 for 100 lbs in the winter 1.-
gave the girls 20^{cts} each for Council fees 40
- 15 Murdy went to Cornwall to a Son of Scotland meeting
Jimie went to a sale at Cashin's Glen, (McBains)
he got nothing
- 16 Fine bright day, roads very bad, not many
in church
- 17 Birdie went to the Glen to teach for Maryboy,
whose brother is very poor
- 18 Made a small washing
- 19 All week so far has been fine, Jimie got
three pike in the pappils
- 20 Farguhersons brought 5 gallons of syrup
I sold 6 doz eggs at 66^{cts} at M. C. Simmons. And
got for 1 lb tea 14^{cts}, 2 1/2 yds satin 30^{cts}, 3 yds
of cotton 30, 3 spools thread 12, 1 paper pins 3
- 21 Fine day
- 22 Another fine day. 70 2 1/2 lbs butter 45^{cts}
- 23 Fine day a good congregation
- 24 Marion went to the Glen to teach for Mary
McLennan this week, and Birdie is to teach
here for Christina
- 25 Fine day looks like rain
- 26 Allie D. Roy died this morning, will be
buried Friday. Pa & I drove out to
the wake house, in afternoon, found
the family very composed, the roads
are in some places atrociously bad
particularly between the village and
the Hill. Went to Prayer Meeting, 16 present
- 27 Fine day, Jimie got 2 meacurs today & two
yesterday

28. Very fine warm day, more like May than
April. A very large funeral, all the Foresters*
turned out, and it was a large funeral
John Robertson & Uncle Hugh were here
70 2 1/2 lbs butter 45^{cts} 1 lb tea 30, meat 6 cloves 83
Uncle Hugh & John were here attending
the funeral, 70 1 lb tea 30, 2 1/2 lbs butter 44^{cts} 74
- 29 Sold 3 doz eggs, 33^{cts}
29. Saturday warm 80 in shade
- 30 Sunday very warm 84, not many in church
The last day of April, and warm enough
for July.
