My canoe is there but full of ice took some out of it took home
a load of wood cutting the ice at the shore for fear the cattle
will get in for they must go out to the far off waterhole
Boiling and raining some East wind high this 3 days now
31st Last Day of the Month in the Bush keeping the canoe

April the 1st East Wind not running very well in the Bush
