10. Edith took sick with a bad attack of indigestion etc.
12. Finished cleaning turnips to town. 51 lbs of small turnips at 30¢ per lb.

15. Went to the Glen for Pillsbury who came to help Edith for a few days.
18. A very stormy Sunday and very few were out at Sunday School.
19. Took Pillsbury to the Glen in the afternoon.
20. A very stormy day blocking the roads again.
21. Went to Paris in the afternoon to meet Fred Carie.
22. Started to draw manure to the fields, using the new Letter Carrier to haul direct from stable and box stalls.
24. Repaired and put storm gate on at the end of the lane.
25. Rev. Mr. Edwards of Paris came out to our S.S. and gave us a splendid talk on G. M. C. R. work. Mr. Edwards, Robt's Ben and H. Reisman stayed to have tea with us.
26. Finished cutting up a willow tree in the swamp.
27. Went to Forward Movement Banquet in Presby. Church, St. George in the evening. Rev. Mr. Woodside of Brantford the chief speaker.
