4 Ann Hall 1/2 day 35<sup>00</sup> Keeping cold. 12 below

5 At 7-20 A. M. Mercury down to 20. and some say down to 25. That is very cold for March

6 2 lbs codfish 20 vinegar 10 2 loaves 12 42  
W. F. M. I met at Mr Crimmons. May off 50 50  
tea 5. Leaflet 15. Paid May 35. for book 5-5

7 Fine bright day. Hockey boys went to Cornwall  
8 1 gall coal oil 18- 2 loaves 12. Matches 5 35

9 Very fine day. I did not go to church, off 25- 25  
10 Katie Christie came Friday night and remained until Saturday afternoon. She did the ironing

The village was deserted Friday, every available conveyance was in requisition for taking the people to Cornwall to the hockey match

They played until 12 midnight and were tie

11 Ann Hall from 8. A. M. to 4 P. M. 45<sup>00</sup>. Jimmie went North. J. P. here is looking for a girl

12 Fine day. Jimmie got home about 5. P. M

13 Stormy day. Murdy was not out since Saturday has another gum boil

John Laviollette paid 5<sup>00</sup> 2 P. M. cleared up Jimmie went North, To 4 loaves 24<sup>00</sup>

Paid Jimmie 1.75 for the bag of wheat - Got on 28<sup>th</sup> Feb. Gave a cheque on the Merchants Bank

for \$7.50 to Louis Cooran for cutting 10 cords of stove wood Murdy pretty bad Beginning to storm
