1874

 had a rather slim meeting.

TUESDAY 2

1874

Sowed $1\frac{1}{2}$ bush Hungarian
 grass seed on $2\frac{1}{4}$ acres
 harrowed and rolled the
 ground well, it just wants
 the rain now to make things
 all right. The early Roses
 are just coming up in the
 garden, rhubarb is abundant
 but this season - Spent
 evening at practice in Glenageary
 for an open Lodge.

WEDNESDAY 3

Finished the manure hauling
 on the fallow just about
 55 loads on it, the yards
 are all cleaned out except
 the sheep pens. Received
 a letter from R P Campbell
 of "Campbell's cross". A
 newspaper from Leathage
 and another from New York.
