10 A & Henry Scuffled Corn in field with two Scufflers A M then they helped Benji till noon. They drove in 5 big loads hay P M. I March helped I went to David Reesor's barn raising P M I taught school W. very warm 80 deg

11 A got Homer Chief & Billy Shool Henry Scuffled Corn then they drove in Henry helped Benji P M I taught school & went to Cedar Grove with Bather & Eger after school W. pretty warm clear. Cloudy this morn Joe Wideman came about bedtime today all night

12 I cut several east of young Orchard Henry put Paris Green on Potatoes. A mowed along fences in Sewall A helped Flourish & Henry drove in hay rickings P M W. pretty warm Jess Reesor's wife & Esther Mingan were here to supper

13 A helped Flourish all day I & Henry got 2 Posts in Shank Swamp & ran mow over old Orchard to cut rubbish that grew up in it A M then Henry helped Flourish P M I & J brought in

good load of hay out of Sewall east of young Orchard W. pretty warm I went to Cedar Grove A M

Monday 14 all went to Meeting at Hebron except J remarks by Bro C Sermon on Luke part of 6 C by C Burkholder Hessman's were here to dinner Ada Hans Flourish & Children & Russell to supper Bro C & Becca were here to supper too Russell stays again to go to school W. very warm

15 A helped Flourish all day Henry mowed fence corner A M he helped Benji P M I took quilt out to Bro O's corn he Scuffled Potatoes P M W. very warm about 90 deg M No Sarah was here to dinner Paul Reesor brought his son Martin to board here to go to school

16 Benji Scuffled Mangels A M they gathered & took in some fence corner hay & local Mangels P M W. very warm I think the warmest yet

17 Benji mowed Mangels A M I & Henry Mary & Anne went to a gathering of the Reesor family near Coon Creek till it is now 100 years since my Great Grandfather came to Coon Creek from Pennsylvania & took up his land
