I went down to Sid's this morning and got Queen shod. I was there till noon as there were two others ahead of me. This afternoon I finished cleaning out another row of straw berries and hauled out some of the couch grass in the summer of allow. Mary did up to matoes. Very hot & dry

Saturday September 5th

I swept the school house first thing this morning and spent most of the remainder of the day hoeing straw berries finishing the job about four o'clock. I then picked some crab apples at at her suggestion. Mary & Harry B took them down and delivered them to Mesdames Marr & Gilbert, who ordered them the other day. Harry B. got out and knocked at the doors so that Mary didn't have to tie Queen up. Gay and I washed up the dinner dishes cleaned up the kitchen and amased the baby and were down at the mail box when Mary & H. B. drove home. An other wise happy day was somewhat marred by Willie Shand bringing us a telephone message from Mrs. Smythe inviting us to their cottage for dinner to-morrow. Cloudy & cool most of the day.

Sunday September 6th

The folly of anticipating evils was exemplified to-day as attendance at Mrs. Smythe's dinner party proved to be impossible owing to the fact that it rained nearly all day not very hard but steadily, so we spent a very comfortable and leisurely day at home, I didn't even have to change my old clothes although Mary did make me shave.
