## Conclusions Concerning Anesthetics.

Nitrous oxide is the anesthetic of choice for short operations, manipulations and examinations. It is also the anesthetic of choice in operations on patients with seriously impaired kidneys, and often in cases in extremely bad condition, as typhoid perforations, general peritonitis, etc. It should not be employed in patients with bad hearts. It is not as satisfactory an anesthetic as ether, and it should not be employed in preference to ether in patients who are good surgical risks.—*Bevan; Surg. Gyn. and Obset.*
