- 6 Gock went to Brockville with A load of turnips for James Hutchison sold them for 1.3 per Bushel he retailed them again I went to Charleston with 36 pork barrels for D Beers then went to Farmersville & got our cloth 41<sup>3/4</sup> gave Mr Camble 4 dollars in part gave John Kincaid <sup>1/2 bush</sup> the Rev Mr Mc Murry preached in Kenton 24
- 8 Painted boards for the floor of the house 25
- 9 fixed the floor upstairs & killed 2 spring pigs Gock & the boys drew some wood Thoma
- 10 tore up the floor of the house & took out the sleepers & put in new ones 20
- 11 worked at the house Gock went to Brockville with turnips 21
- 11 worked at the house Gock went to Brockville with A load of turnips for Wm Hutchison A very stormy day rain & sleet 28
- 12 worked at the house fine thaw day 2
- 13 Do Do Do A grandson of the Widow Hill was buried in cantown 3.
- 14 no Meeting to Day it was so stormy <sup>snow</sup> rain 3.
- 15 worked at the house 3.
- 16 drew some wood from the mountain
- 17 went to Mallorytown to A sale bought A chain pump for 2 dollars <sup>12</sup> twelve feet long
