Ida had a cancer. when they opened her sat. Just
Read & Hattie to Wells Hattie went over to Krater
after them. at night - Bertha. Hattie & the Co. Leflin folks
all went to the station. Hattie took them & spent the day
in Riepmgers had a good visit. their whole faced
snare had a cold in the night. cold wind. Arthur
working in the eleven acre field. Mary up to Peter
Tue 25. Marjorie & Hattie started over the river to see Ida
but could not see her there so low Hattie stayed in
Beyers all night & Marjorie came over & stayed in
Fennies. I churned for our selves Riepmgers Red
their son Arthur & Will went over. they finished their
field then came down here & desked a lot here
Wed 26. We shed the hens up he started in sow herd
Arthur harrowed & Will sowed & desked & Arthur desked
but it looks like rain east wind for 3 days I sowed
a lot out of the basket. Marjorie & Hattie came home
Paul drove up a night with homaloh & cellary plants
& 2 loaves bread & 25¢ sugar
Thur 27. raining this morning poured at times the
sun came out nice in the afternoon they are working
on the field this afternoon. Marjorie went over & Phoned
in Hattie about Ida. Hattie went over & Phoned
Friday 28 I churned the first thing so Marjorie could go in
Chippawa to see about what train Will would take home
for Toronto. Will & Arthur worked in the oats all day
after Marjorie went to Chippawa I washed up a lot of my clothes
everything I had was dirty I washed Pauls clothes & found that
a cold wind had in fact on a coat every time I hung out any thing

Sat 29. Hattie took her father & Will & ell to the station. took eggs
1 doz got a gl-vinegar & can pumpkin 10¢ & I made 3 pumpkin pies
a ginger cake & a thong cake. Arthur finishing up the oat ground
he swept the front room & Marguerite dusted. she swept the dining room & washed
her curtains & some of her things & the children. I washed what I washed
& finished the kitchen work
Sun 30 We expected the childrens father but he did not come. Hattie
walked to the brick church. Paul came up from London. Arthur took
him to the station at night. Riepmgers girls here on the evening
Mon 31. Arthur did some furrowing out on the oat field then ploughed
the potato patch & a land for garden turns up on big lumps &
fixed my flower bed by the house & planted some seeds. Marjorie
looked her gladiolus up for him in plough. Will came back from Toronto
June 1909

Tue 1. They started on their corn ground. Paul came back from London
after he came Marjorie & him ^{he bought the patch} went to Drummondville. had 3 lbs butter 24¢-5¢
Sun day eggs @ 18¢ 3¢. - 8¢ butter paper 5¢ radish seed 3¢ bread 10¢
after they got home he made Popsy harrow the patch & got the
tomatoes & cellary in I cleared up the dining room & swept washed
the churn I churned yesterday. made pan cakes for dinner
Wed 3. he put the Petunias out & I carried 2 pails of water from
the creek for them & the cellary. Marjorie went to Riepmgers
after pieplant & I made 2 pies before she got home with some
Paul got in the other house. I made ginger cookies Marjorie
baked a big baking of bread the house like an oven
Thur 3. I got 14 eggs from Hattie. to see a hen the only one we have
Marjorie put out turn onion sets on the big pie. I planted a lot
of flower seed. Hattie came over yesterday & we divided the big
sweet-scented Geranium. I churned for our selves Marjorie working on
Marguerite's sunbonnet & her pocket Jennie gave her Paul helped
