 11 It is threatening rain all day. I worked a good deal in the garden today. The boys are at the manse fixing up for the town social which is to come off tonight if the rain keeps off
 12 About 4 P M. Miss E. Litch of Cornwall came to to remain a few days. She and Marion went for a while to the
