- 31 Another fine day. To steak 40^{cts}. Washed some white clothes. 2 quilts towels & cupkins churchy.

- 1 Sunday, Very fine, large congregation. I was not in church. Bridie was in for a short while.
- 2 Fine bright day. Jimmie began to plough. To 5 loaves 25^{cts} - I called on Mrs J. H. Ferguson.
- 3 Another fine day. I was out - Bot at Mc Crum Sugar 25^{cts}. 4 yds gray cotton 34. Washing soda 10. 2 1/2 yds B. print 30. Popolia 10. stove black 8. To beef 25^{cts} sent 75 to Administrator for Presbyterian 1.00.
- 4 Dull in morning. Mrs Solomon Larvye rented Pine house, for six months. Paid in advance \$9.00. To 1 brown, bamboo handle 30. glue 2 lb 10. 4 spools thread 20. 4 quarters of different print 10.
- 5 Rain and snow. The ground was covered. H. F. M. I met at Duncan Campbells. Was off 25^{cts} 10 for Presbyterian. 4 blocks 1/2 yd for quilt. To 5 loaves 25^{cts}. Murdy went to Montreal with his transit - he got it broken yesterday. Jimmie Nicholson, Summerville here about a ditch.
- 6 Raw day. Began to put glue on Murdy's room. Mary McIntyre spent most of day here. Murdy got home at noon. Jimmie ploughing.
- 7 Bright day cool. Pa. paid taxes 39.82. To beef 2 lbs. 9^{cts} 91. Had a letter from Sandy.
- 8 Fine day. Cold wind. A good congregation. A good sermon. my off 5^{cts} = 1.
- 9 Bright day. Kings birthday. Have up the flag. To cotton clothes line 15. Mixing dish 18. Cough drops 10^{cts}. bread 30. Mrs Larvye p. day 25^{cts}.
- 10 Fine day. Jimmie ploughing. Murdy went to Lancaster township.
- 11 To 1 1/2 yds ticking 25. 3.88. Rodded out 25. Thread 10 4-23. To 1 gall coal oil 23. Jimmie ploughing.
- 12 Very fine day. took up a few persimmons. Fine day. Charlott. Dougald spent the afternoon. She is well.
