The Significance of Jaundice.

"The appearance of jaundice, even with absence of any general disturbance, is always a warning to be cautious; it demands that its cause should be discovered, and that the patient be kept under observation, while a corresponding suitable diet and mode of life should be prescribed; for diseases of the bile passages that may appear of little importance may lead to serious disease of the liver (acute atrophy), which, considering the importance of the organ in the economy of the body, may be very dangerous."—Hoppe-Seyler; Med.
