Earache

Hot steam or smoke funneled into the ear usually affords a measure of relief. As a rule it is best not to drop warm oils into the ear, for these occlude the ear and besides they show a tendency to become rancid. Syringing the ear with warm water ameliorates the pain. An atropine solution dropped in the ear gives some relief, as does also a mixture of glycerin, alcohol and water. Moist heat applied externally affords more relief than dry heat or the hot-water bottle.—*Medical Summary.*
