Fri. 1.

July 4th 1892.

The School Picnic being held in the grove opposite the factory, a large number attended it and all seemed to enjoy themselves very much. I gave an exhibition of fire works in honor of the occasion which was highly appreciated by all present.

Tue. 5.

Lovely day a little warmer than yesterday. School teacher went home today (Glenvale) and Mrs. Cowan spent the day at Glenburnie. I placed the boards in her cellar, for to walk on, they having floated away out of place by the recent rain and received orders, during her absence.
