 had cut in the upper field 27th
 Sunday the Boats began to come up
 the canal must be fixed Gordon here
 got his Pants Lots of shooting 28th Morning
 Warm heavy shower East wind sprang up quick
 29th Went to Dundee very foggy took 25 lb of Butter
 8 1/2 Doz Eggs Bought of small man 2 1/2 doz of a pair
 pair of Boots for myself a pair for Randolph 2 1/2
 doz of Tweed 32 lb of Salt Booz of Matches 4 Booz soap
 2 Butter Pennets 1 Doz the and smooth stone 2 1/2 lb of
 Shingles and 3 Booz of Blue Bought of Mr Long Spoon
 1 lb of Powder Bought of Mr Burdo 1 lb of Tobacco

 field with new scythe hay good taking off
 the onions and sterchions the daisy flowers getting
 ripe 30th Morning upper field 31st Morning making
 cocks 1st of September shooting Begg
 on the South side Fine some Rain
 2nd Morning Bann Fine allowed in
 front marsh some caught Cat. 7th
 to night St Francis into Dundee 13

 to Frenois Island to salt the Cattle a
 Fine Day Lucia here for Potatoes Lashy here
 got a line and canoe hook from him
 Williams went off to Lancaster to be ready
 for the Boat wanting to buy Fat Cattle 11th
 made a stack put 83 Cocks in it 12th
 Fine 12th Traded the Basswood Canoe with Mr
 Lashy for his Boat gave Boat 50 cents Cash
 3 lb of Butter 3 Bushel of Potatoes Morning in
 the Back Marsh 13th Morning Morning gathering
 Randolph cropped to get the Sub of Butter
 Weight 2 1/2 lb at Mr Wards 14th High
 South West Wind rained heavy
 1 broke down the Tobacco some 15th Morning
 16th Morning and making cocks in the
 front Marsh made 80 Killed 2 of the
 young Ducks got Pay for the Sub of Butter
 17th Mr & Mrs Galbeau here he
 comes out to take the fresh air on
 the Lake has their bunch at the head
 of the Island took the wife and I
 up to treat us Prince Louise
 made 2 Trips to Lancaster to Day
