 Williams burr Munnie Camb 2nd January 1850
 3rd Miss Brooks Day Munnie's Kanutians helped
 to unload a load of hay with loads and torn
 4th James M. Douglas and Frank's boys here
 Gordon came from 79 - long with Munnie
 5th John Angus Birth Day 1850th Arriving
 pulling in 8 hours Done leaving in
 the upper field 9th Munnie and the Williams
 Dan there and the 16 actor Mr. here till the
 meeting to night Mr. Lemson & the 18th 1850
 10th Came from Williams burr brought
 I see Munnie on Dish Matches 12th Munnie
 smoking for the 13 boats helping John to put
 in the stoves in the Boats most all the
 campers gone took John's coat by mistake
 of the seal for my own. Put the farm
 valley field to Mr. MacFarlane Island
 on the Bohemian 11th chimney Hamel
 on the 12th Rk. Bougat here putting in
 had Hamel the 13th bought Tea soap
 14th commenced the stack left 30 each
 went to night

James Cameron Island Sept 1850
 Raining commenced the 15th at 10 o'clock to rain
 Mr. M. D. Gordon & son of the late Donald J
 and Mr. Spulshere about the Island very
 fine men created me with a good Drop
 of Lin. Thomas Eliumac along with them
 14th took up some Potatoes left them in a
 box outside cutting hay in the Back Marsh
 put up 75 coeks 40997 or smoky E Wind
 15th finished the stack put 114 coals in it went
 down with the Fishermen to get up their seine
 as it is fast in a Big log in the Bottom had
 to have 2 Boats Randolph in helping them with
 Wash Wind put corn stalks at every 500 in the stack
 of 1000 at 10th of 1000 at 10th of 1000 at 10th of 1000
 16th Fairfield & Mr. Allister came from Williams burr
 the Loan of J. Ramell's hand saw took in sugar
 here went to Williams burr John and John
 got a Present of 1 lb. of Tea 1 lb. of sugar & tobacco

 of Bushel of salt 50 lb of flour 13 lb of the King
 Worm Candy 1/2 Pinc (Book a Pad of faces glass
 oil High Wines salt at the Light House with
 Lathin Rogers wife came up and Doughter
 and son Lashy at the 18th they were to say
 and stop here Mr. Fairfield & Mr. Allister here
 Lewis Benedict the Fishman (having them 13 Rames
 before this morning took up some Potatoes took
 some some Wood got 2 sticks for to make
 a Chamber Mrs. Abigail Washington moved
 clothes having the hinges on the door
 Lashy Bought sergies 13/6 Blue 20th at the
 Chamber Morning at Potatoes 21st fine putting in
 corn stalks last day of Summer 22nd fine putting in
 then I bought 1 lb. of color Fine Working at the Chamber
 Steamer or Cliner Wife No Girl Mrs. Anne Betty
 and I think I cryer left here yesterday
