Shock.—A true condition of postoperative shock not caused by hemorrhage, unnecessarily prolonged operations, or badly administered anesthetics, is rarely seen. When such shock does occur, saline solution subcutaneously with the aid of morphine, and camphorated oil every 2 or 3 hours will accomplish about all that can be done.—*Balfour; Mayo Clinic. Med. Record.*
