got 1 lb currants and 3 lb rice 25 25
- 7 Sunday, a collection in Church for the
Augmentation fund, I gave \$0.50. 50
- 8 Got 1 lb blue 10 cts, yeast 10, lead pencil 25 25
- 9 Fine day, P. & I spent this evening at
John As. Jimmie & Birdie went to Martintown
to the lodge Old Bunk 1940 lbs hay
10. Very fine day. Far left early for Glen
Nice. D. P. M. not back yet, I was at
prayer meeting, Mr McNaughton organizing
a singing school, got 37 waxen. 5 cts a night
- 11 Storming all day, got 4 lbs butter 80 cts 80
- Jimmie out Monday with plough and will
have to go as soon as this storm is over
- 12 Jimmie out with plough, storming yet
- 13 The storm is over, and it is very frosty. There
were few on the road today, Bird got 7 lb sugar 31.00
The mail carrier did not come from Martintown
last night
