31st Last Day of May Raining West Wind Dug some
Stones A Fortunate Day 1st of June the glorious
First of June Vickys Birth Day 1878 Unfortunate
Day Fine E Wind Changed to West Blew hard
Seander to Lancaster Bought Boots Tea Soap
Loch Nobs hinges Broom-hanger Stickle for a Door
with the change of Wind commenced to Blow
and Rain hard Stanley Drawing the Sticks
for the Pig-Pen Made the Pen Thunder-
and Lightning passed down North East put
the Pigs in their new place 2nd Fine Day
Trinity Sunday Willie Morris and George & Ed
came John H and Eddy Renshaw here 2 of the
Drudge Men here Thunder and Lightning
Windy commenced to Rain Rained all night
Shooting at Blackbirds taking up the corn
3rd Raining Billy Working at overhead
Work Black cow calved 2 Days ago Billy
and George went off 4th Old George the 2nd
Birth Day it used to be kept up for a
long time Fernandez went to Lancaster
Went for 2 Ready made Shirts 80 cents Working
at stairs in our Room

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Unfortunate Day Fine Day Fernandez came
back my shirts gave me my change sheared
4 of the Sheep Ed Renshaw came home with
the Plough Working in the North End up
overhead up Stairs Stanley and Seander
Unfortunate Day Corpus Christie Went
around the Island Working up stairs Stanley
Harroving the Back Piece sowed 4 1/2 Bushels
of oats Letting the Black Bull out at night
Putting him in the Day Time Fernandez
Crossed Looks like Rain Raining to the South East
Thunder one of the Big Sea-Boats went up
this Evening 2 Bushel more sowed that's 5 Bushels
Rained to night 7th Rained hard Fernandez
Hung the North Kitchen Door Boarding up
stairs Foggy West Wind Received a Letter from
Dan Hilda Poorly 3 Men from the Steamer
of the Drudge For Butter 4 lbs 80 cents 4 Doz of
Eggs 48 cents Heard the Miss Websters came
to Hamilton's Island to Camp The old Gentleman
to be up next Week Stanley and Seander splitting
Logs 8th Raining Showery Fine Sawing Stove at the
Door cloudy Foggy 9th All Saints Marys Birth
Day 1813 Raining Foggy Rainbow in the Evening
Happy to St Regis Grand Procession Sacrament
at Salem Church Sumnerstown took
over more Hens 2 of the Boys crossed to night
cant be for church as each one has a Boat
North Wind Unfortunate Day caught a Kingfisher
10th A Fortunate Day very Fine Day one of the
Big Sea-going vessels went down Drawing the
sawed Stove wood Blocks from of the Field to
the House Drew off some Stones Ploughing up the West
side of the Corn as the Birds and Hens took it up Fernandez
