

James Cameron Island 16<sup>th</sup> Oct 1894  
Windy Raining the Horses put on  
Last night Leander seen the Partridge  
in the Bush to Day he must  
have flew here from the south side  
as I have known them to do that  
some years ago killed 2 Fowls  
The Lucias here for Butter  
17<sup>th</sup> Unfortunate Day Rain and  
Wind Thunder & Lightning Last  
night Ploughed a little Horses  
Dont work right Drew some  
stones to the Bank Fixed a  
Barrel put Hoops on it churned  
a Rambow 2 mock suns on the  
South side of the Sun some Hail  
to Day a Lot of Ducks flying to day  
2 Partridge in the Bush now  
18<sup>th</sup> St Lukes Day Fine Windy  
some Drops of Rain Plastering  
The stable pulled the 3 wirps  
Working some at an ear at  
stove wood (Partridge) Lots of  
Shooting not many Ducks  
19<sup>th</sup> Ploughing went to the Bush  
Broke the harness Fine 20<sup>th</sup> Fine  
Rained & Wind Rained some  
Leander hunting got 2 Randolph  
came had the Mail came  
for Leander to go to Doug  
Gordon came

at  
James Cameron Island 21<sup>st</sup> Oct 1894  
2<sup>nd</sup> Wind Lucias here for Butter  
Gordon crossed to Summerston  
22<sup>nd</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> Wind Lots of Shooting  
Lucias here they are going home  
Tomorrow Mowed some Marsh  
Gray for covering the sheds Lots  
of shooting to Day Banking the  
the stable North side Windy  
23<sup>rd</sup> Sinnerias (B Day Sissy) 1868  
Fine & Wind commenced to Rain  
Made a cheese a Good Lot of  
Shooting a Drudge went up  
24<sup>th</sup> Giv Hugh's B Day Fine  
& Wind Few Drops of Rain Drew  
a Load of Wood with Dick took  
the Fence away from the apple tree  
at the wet place Mr Stickler June  
here Paired up with his Sandseaw  
Boiling Potatoes for the Pigs in  
the Potato field took the chain  
down from the camp Windy  
25<sup>th</sup> My Birth Day 1825  
69 years to Day at 4.0 clock  
noon a Fine Day & Wind put  
the Butternuts in the storehouse  
Randolph here from the Little  
Island north side took in the  
cheese the Steamer Large went  
down seen a very large flock  
of Wild Geese very high going  
South East STC Wether Day
