- 28 Put in two loads the last that was cut (milk) Mrs Ellis paid 2<sup>00</sup> she is behind 1<sup>00</sup> get for the 2 months ending the 26<sup>th</sup> I am to allow her 25 for Ellis 2 hours pruning currant bushes To pan bread 20. lard oil 25- To 3 lb steak at Sandy McIntyre 30<sup>00</sup>
- 29 Fine day, very hot I was not in church
- 30 Quite a storm of wind and rain distant thunder about 7 P.M. yesterday, and showers all through the night
- 31 Ellen Pullman day 25. Mrs Pidgeon paid 3<sup>00</sup> for rent. May called, loaned me clippings of Yorum & Alexanders meeting in Ottawa

- 2 To 1 bottle of D.P.F. Prescription 1<sup>00</sup>
- 3 To sugar 1<sup>00</sup> pan bread 20, 2 lbs steak 20 1 40
- 4 2 To 3 lbs butter from factory. Marion got home
- 3 Rain today the boys got in the hay, Calm 15
- 4 Some rain, To 3 lb steak 45, bread 20 ginger 10 Lamp burner 15, 3 lbs steak at McIntyre 15
- 5 Aunt Mary remained over until evening then came for her just as it began to rain
- 6 Rain, Marion was called on a cart at Red Mc Kenzie Lancaster
- 7 Mrs St Thomas paid 2<sup>00</sup> for rent.
- 8 Paid 3<sup>00</sup> for 6 days of road work, To 5 loaves 25- 3 25
- 9 Ellen should have come to work yesterday but did not so I done it myself. Most every day is very hot - mercury up to 80 and over.
- 10 The milk is sour this morning.
- 9 Fine, bright, warm but not unbearable
- 10 Very fine day. Dot bought 1 load of hay. The 100<sup>00</sup> Deposited in the Williamstown Branch of the Merchants Bank \$60<sup>00</sup>
- 11 Fine in morning. To 1 lb butter at Willie 25- 25 To 5 lbs veal. Dan Bush, 25. 4 loaves 20 45
- 12 Click McDonald By Cash, rent, \$2.50 Donald Mc Crimon By Cash, \$20<sup>00</sup> for ground rent. Jimmie went to Cornwall. The old boy known begins today
- 13 Had some rain, which cooled the air
- 12 Fine cool day, I was not in church
- 13 Fine and cool. Marion came home in evening Mrs Robertson & Miss Macdonald called. Mrs Robertson wishes me to go to Cornwall tomorrow
