- 30 Fine day Jimmie put in three loads of oats had Oliver Colette helping. The steam thrasher came this evening and was on our end of Wellington St to go in the morning to Mr Govins
- 31 Dull today To 4 loaves 24. Jimmie was alone in forenoon and had to pitch and drive and make the load, he put in two loads and took home a jag at noon. In afternoon he got A. M. L. They were not 44 hour, when it began to rain, and rained all afternoon and now 8 P. M. still raining.
