Sxt 3 Bottom Logs at the East end of the house  
25<sup>th</sup> Randolph crossed to Summersetown Branch  
of the Susquehanna 3 lb of Tea 25 cents P.M. Relief 25 cents  
Bought of Mr Ward shinglemills 2 cents Match 4 cents  
pipe 1 cent got a 13 oz of Apples from Hamptons  
Dishaw for 10 cents says I recd 9 of them 30<sup>th</sup> Fine  
Mr David Bakers Wife Departed 31<sup>st</sup>  
all Hallows or Hallowe eve Cindy Kammung  
Rodney Briggs and Johnny Bone came up from  
Suppliers Island hunting no Ducks no Geese  
John Bone gave me some caps and shot  
Took dinner cracking nuts keeping  
the Cellophon the night Butter short  
since last year some Beech and Hickory in  
Oak and Hazel 1st Day November  
All Saturday very hot wind started to  
cross turned back Mr David Bakers Wife  
Buried to day Billy Bone & Doctor Bridges  
Lance Leanders say Kammung treated me at their B.  
2<sup>nd</sup> all souls day Gordon left Hamptons across  
for apples got 3 bushels Potatoes 1 Bushel  
Mrs Crimmon there Tom and Gordon over  
to Covington yesterday Bought of Ward  
2 cents of matches Heard Roryelle going  
came home oil forgot my coat  
3<sup>rd</sup> Sryer for Butter Borrowed the 1m  
an hour Randolph and I to Steuron Island  
Painted the Decouys 4<sup>th</sup> Paul Grey Jacob  
and I more I said and here Port stand in  
the Spear stopp you all night got 2 such  
5<sup>th</sup> Grey Fox Wks Day Randolph  
for the Wool got it at Wards got  
2 bushels of Potatoes from  
Crimmon.

Mr. Wm. Cameron Island Nov. 6<sup>th</sup> 1880  
Dr. Henry Benie here a fine Day Waining East Wind a Great  
lot of Shooting Putting a Runner in the Pump  
Broke one of them & Helen's Boat Day  
High West Wind Knocked Down Trees down the  
Roof of the Cookhouse The Traveller Let go 4  
Bangs and their in the Bushes & the Princeps  
went for the Barge to the Kit Kit and towed her  
to Lancaster 5<sup>th</sup> Fixing the Door on the  
alvest<sup>th</sup> Place taking up some of the traps Wining  
at Wood 12<sup>th</sup> Martinmas 12<sup>th</sup> Banker Stone 13<sup>th</sup>  
Snowing Wood. 14<sup>th</sup> Sunday Hines C. & son were  
here 2 or 3 loads of shot snowing some fine  
15<sup>th</sup> Randolph send to the Kit Kit Dyer  
left yesterday took home my anger 16<sup>th</sup>  
Went to see if I could Borrow a Boat  
stop at Hamillton up to the store  
Went to Antwerp see if I could Borrow a  
Boat But I got Charles' (vai's) 13<sup>th</sup>  
Bought of Mr. Ward 1 lb. Rice 2 cent of Hatch  
Pike, Hamillars sending of their Tugles  
Tom Drawing Manure from Rose's lot  
a Bag of Potatoes from John 18<sup>th</sup>  
Snowing hard 18<sup>th</sup> Chopping stove  
Wood Hamilton for the 5 Horses frank  
implanted Santine and Tom had Breckin  
son got kind of sick to night all night  
not very well Randolph Drawing Wood  
nowing Drifters Sparry Breaking the  
ice yesterday out to Lancaster to day 21<sup>st</sup>  
in the Day the Month D. 1846

Boat out of ground to day 22<sup>nd</sup> 1846  
got Mr. Summers a Blight Wood  
Snowing Wood: 6<sup>th</sup> Snowing & Wind Warm  
Wood putting Marsh hay in the Barge  
Drawing Wood 8<sup>th</sup> High Wind 10<sup>th</sup>  
avg 18.6 10<sup>th</sup> Wind 8<sup>th</sup> Wind 10<sup>th</sup> Salvoes  
turned stone
