Post-Operative Suggestions.

8. The length of time that the patient should be allowed to go without passing his urine before catheterization depends on whether or not the bladder is found to be full. If there is any doubt, and the patient cannot pass his urine, catheterization, with the greatest possible asepsis, should be done. When catheterization has been done more than once hexamethylenamin should be administered, in 5-grain doses, three or four times in twenty-four hours, for several days, unless there is some condition of the stomach that will prevent it.—
