Typhoid Differential Diagnosis—No. 5.

A lobar pneumonia which is a septicemia with a localized process of acute inflammation in the lung may be the beginning of typhoid fever, or, if caused by the pneumococcus or another organism or by a mixed infection (two or more organisms) may cause a toxemia like that of typhoid fever. The differential points are daily physical examinations of the chest and abdomen, a careful study of the pulse and respiration, especially of their ratio to each other, and the examination of the blood (agglutination tests and blood cultures).—*Rueck; Med. Record.*
