- 9 Fine bright day Mercury down to zero. Milked for the last time until spring. W. F. M. S. met at Mr Cooks. My annual fee 1⁰⁰ off 25. And off for H. M. S. 25 Tea 5 100 of hen feed 1.25 1.30
- 10 Soney Santons cut wood in afternoon. Do 2 loaves 12 Snow storm from East
- 11 Rain all afternoon 2 loaves 12
- 12 Snow out off to church 50, Communion 60
- 13 Kind of soft 2 loaves 12 ~~W. F. M. S. meeting~~ 12
- 14 Got ready for Ann. she did not come. To 2 loaves 12 Gave McDonald 50^{cts} He was all day sawing wood. had his boy
- 15 Very fine day, Ann 1/2 day 35^{cts}. The clothes all dried

- 16 Fine but dull no sun. To 2 loaves 12 1/2 gall coal oil 20 25 lbs flour 75 12
- 17 Rain all day Murdy left in morning for Valleyfield. Paid Jimie for insurance on property east of Johnson road \$20.75 for 3 years. Paid my tax 20.62 by order on Bank. 20-75 62
- 18 Rain all day, slighing gone, ice on the road worn to the mud. To 4 loaves 24 began to snow about 6. P. M. Murdy got home at 6.30 P. M. 24
- 19 All nature looks lovely. The trees shrubs and bushes and fences were wet, when the large flakes of snow fell. Today every thing looks like ostriches feathers. Not many in church. Sent my off 25 25
- 20 Still some of the plumage left on the trees. A. M. L. came at 9.30 A. M. to split wood he went with Jimie to bring home some hay and straw
- 21 Inspector Th. Donald from Alexandria is trying to convict some parties of selling liquor. Dan MacLennan was here. John H. Robertson N. Branch called on business. Sent word to Far to take two shares in The Hill Telep for me. if I have the cash. It will cost about \$2.28. To 4 loaves 24 1 gall coal oil 20 1 darning needle 1⁰⁰ Ladies from Cornwall selling ball tickets 44
- 22 Kind of raw day. Masquerade or rink tonight. The moon is about full. Last night was radiant tonight may be as fine
- 23 Very fine
- 24 Musty. To skinned cod fish 50^{cts}
- 25 Lovely in morning. Now 3.30 gloomy. It will be strange if Mums birthday will pass of nicely. M. Donald and Neil sitting and putting in the wood. 4 loaves 24
