corn binder which Reynolds & I had bought
25. Hired Bob Mc Donald to take his potatoes to Paris
26. Drove the remainder of rails from fence next Dabjella barn.
27. Very stormy days, more like a March storm than Dec.
10. Edith & I went to Paris, taking Leone to see Aunt Betsy.
11. Drove a load of hay to cement works
13. Went to Will Reynolds sale in the afternoon, bought a Messy  
Harris Seed drill for \$6.00, Edith & Leone visited at Pelmans.
14. Took a load of potatoes to Brantford @ \$25 per bag
15. Bought new feed-carrier & track, home from St. George  
Clarence Newton helped put up a load of wheat in afternoon
17. Dominion Election Day when the Union Government was  
sustained by a substantial majority.  
Edith & I went to Uncle Tom Sharps for dinner.
18. Edith, Leone & I went to Woodstock for the day, had a nice visit
19. Took a load of wheat to Paris, went to concert at School at night
20. Took Geese & Chickens to Brantford market, the geese sold  
readily alive but not the chickens drove to Long meadow for a little visit
21. Went to R. Dring's sale and took a run up to Walt on the car.
22. Went to St. George to get a parcel from Estane
24. Picked 11 chickens in the afternoon for Tom's trade
25. Went to Lillanster & Will Millers for Tom's dinner and afternoon
28. A very cold day, called at Armstrongs, Congost's & Williams on  
behalf of Present for Mrs. Ferguson's. Helped R. Mc Donald  
mess hay.
