# Transcript of James Rowand Burgess Diary, December 1911 to September 1914

Diary of James Rowand Burgess recorded in the 152-page "Student's and Reporter's NOTE BOOK" (T. Eaton Co.)

Monday, December 25, 1911
Fine, and thawing a little, wind a little cold, and very little snow on the ground. We took a walk along the road past the cemetery through Chappell's fields till we could see the river. We saw a white rabbit, two or three dandelion flowers partly opened and a caterpillar crawling on the ground.

## Tuesday, December 26, 1911

Dull and somewhat warm, though not as warm as yesterday, with a slight fall of snow after dark.

## Wednesday, December 27, 1911

Cold with very high winds, rain the early part of the day and snow later on.
Thursday, December 28, 1911
Very stormy like yesterday, much colder, no rain.

## Friday, December 29, 1911

Bright and cold with a little snow and not much wind.

## Saturday, December 30, 1911

Pleasant cold and with some falls of snow, now occasionally... [paper ripped]

## Sunday, December 31, 1911

Mr. David Kennedy has taken very ill this morning.

## Monday, January 1, 1912

New Year's Day. Cold with strong wind at first, then calming down. Papa and Mama went out to Christie's on the 10:20 train and returned on the afternoon train.

## Tuesday, January 2, 1912

Cold and disagreeable with slight falls of snow at intervals.
Wednesday, January 3, 1912
Pleasant but a little cold. School started. Oliver did not come as he had a bad cold. Mr. D. Kennedy is a great deal better than he was on Saturday [December 31].

## Thursday, January 4, 1912

A little stormy with a little snow and cold.
Friday, January 5, 1912
Very cold with a little snow.

## Saturday, January 6, 1912

Very cold and snowing most of the day, and quite a fall of snow last night. Oliver came in to-night and will stay all Sunday.

NO ENTRY SUNDAY JANUARY 7th

## Monday, January 8, 1912

Cold and very strong with much snow. Uncle Gilbert Aberdour came in this morning on the train, was here for dinner and is going to stay all night. I paid my fees this afternoon for the winter term at the high school. We had an examination in Arithmetic and I had 80 and Oliver 44.

## Tuesday, January 9, 1912

Much the same as yesterday, [the] road full of drifts. Uncle Gilbert went away on the train this morning. I got my cheek frozen this week, though I do not know what day.

Wednesday, January 10, 1912

Much like yesterday. The snow plough was up this way for the first time since the beginning of the winter. Noble took Papa's dinner down and he had it at the office. The meeting of the Farmer's Institute was postponed to sometime in February. Trains are very late. The mail train was due 6 hours ago and is not in yet. Here comes the mail train now. This is a mistake...it was the snow plough going back.

## Thursday, January 11, 1912

Snow falling. Very cold but little wind. I got a library book out of P.E. H.S. library entitled "The Spy" by J. Fenimore Cooper. We found our exam is to be Geography on Monday.

## Friday, January 12, 1912

Bright and calm but very cold. The temperature at 10 p.m. is 15 degrees below zero. We had an inter-form debate after recess this afternoon. On our side, Leader Dell, other speakers, Nelson and Miss Switzer against the second form debaters Miss Francis Hanbidge, Miss Clazie and Wagner. Subject resolved that Socal [sic] Option is better than License. Our side had the negative and the second form side the affirmative. The Rev. Mr. Cooley was judge and he decided in favour of the affirmative side. The second form has won the championship as it did last year when in the first form.

## Saturday, January 13, 1912

Very cold but mostly fine. Said to have been 20 degrees below zero at 3 a.m. By our thermometer it was 2 below zero at 10:30 p.m.

NO ENTRY SUNDAY JANUARY 14th

## Monday, January 15, 1912

Cold and stormy. Oliver did not get in to school till 9:30. Robert MacCrae got his face frozen this morning and also on Friday night. I got weighed this morning and my weight was $1083 / 4 \mathrm{lbs}$. I gave my finger a pinch with the sewing machine today but it is not very sore.

## Tuesday, January 16, 1912

Cold and a little stormy at 8 a.m. The temperature was 2 degrees above zero.

## Wednesday, January 17, 1912

Cold and fine. Arthur and Edgar Burgess were in today with a load of hay. Oliver and I have started to build a fort in the garden.

Thursday, January 18, 1912
Mild with snow and rain. Mama and Oliver were at Christie's and Geddeses all but Bessie and Johnnie were there too. Johnnie sold his mask rat skins yesterday. Messrs. Hill and Knox were at Christie's yesterday. They drove over to get some cattle. We got our marks today and Oliver and I both got 78 marks. Our next exam is algebra.

Friday, January 19, 1912
Cold and somewhat stormy with a north wind.
Saturday, January 20, 1912
Cold and stormy with a south wind.
NO ENTRY SUNDAY JANUARY 21st
Monday, January 22, 1912
Cold with little wind. Uncle Gilbert was in at Gilbert Lamont's funeral today.

## Tuesday, January 23, 1912

Mild and snowy. Snow falling both during the night. We got our marks today. Oliver got 74 and I got 62.

## Wednesday, January 24, 1912

Mild and fine with snow in the latter part of the day.

## Thursday, January 25, 1912

Fine and cold. A little past eight this morning thermometer registered 19 degrees below zero. At 10 p.m. it registered 14 degrees below zero.

## Friday, January 26, 1912

Fine and cold. Between 8 and 9 a.m. 17 degrees below zero.

## Saturday, January 27, 1912

Cold and fine. Uncle Sandy, Aunt Lizzie and Florence were in town today.
NO ENTRY SUNDAY JANUARY 28th

## Monday, January 29, 1912

Mild with sleet. We had an examination in History.
Tuesday, January 30, 1912

Mild with a little snow. We have got our marks. Oliver got 66 and I got 70 . We were at the Farmer's Institute meeting. Mr. Groh, Mr. Wismer, Mr. Ball, Miss Powell, Mrs. McTavish, Mrs. Cameron and Mrs. Lowry spoke and the Port Elgin orchestra gave several fine selections.

## Wednesday, January 31, 1912

Cold and fine. I got 1 mark more in my history examination as Mr. Nelson made a mistake.

## Thursday, February 1, 1912

Cold and fine. Jim Rowand came in with Donnie and is staying all night. Uncle Andrew and Aunt Minnie were in today and brought a bag of apples.

## Friday, February 2, 1912

Mild in the morning and cold in the afternoon, with some snow. There is going to be a dance at Christie's tonight. Jim went away home on the 1:40 train. Jet and Nigger have three little ones between them. I've found them all at once so we don't know which belongs to which. One of the little was feeble when we found it and is dead now.

## Saturday, February 3, 1912

Cold and stormy.
NO ENTRY SUNDAY FEBRUARY . 4th

## Monday, February 5, 1912

Cold and stormy. We had an examination in bookkeeping today. Oliver says this party on Friday night came off well. The other of Nigger's little ones died today.

## Tuesday, February 6, 1912

Cold and stormy.

## Wednesday, February 7, 1912

Cold and stormy. The snow plough was up tonight.

## Thursday, February 8, 1912

Cold and stormy. The temperature tonight at 10:25 p.m. is zero degrees. Bessy Geddes came in today and is staying all night. She went to the dentist but she does not know if she is going to get her teeth filled. We had an examination today in Algebra.

Friday, February 9, 1912

Cold and stormy. The temperature was 15 degrees below zero about 7 p.m. Oliver did not go home tonight as it was so cold and stormy.

## Saturday, February 10, 1912

Cold and fine. The temperature was at 31 degrees below zero at about 8 a.m. Oliver went home on train today.

NO ENTRY SUNDAY FEBRUARY . 11th

## Monday, February 12, 1912

Fine and cold. The thermometer registered 16 degrees below zero at about 8 a.m. Oliver did not come in today as he has a bad cold. Uncle Alfred came in yesterday and went home today. Johnnie came in yesterday afternoon and took Bessie home. We had an examination in Grammar today. In the examinations we had last week in Bookkeeping Oliver got 89 and I got 80, and [in] Algebra Oliver got 96 and I got 90.

## Tuesday, February 13, 1912

Fine and cold. The temperature was 19 degrees below zero at about 7:30 a.m. and is 3 degrees above zero shortly before 10 a.m. Oliver came in on the train this afternoon. Darkie had two little ones yesterday but both are dead. I forgot to enter it: Jet's little one died a few days after Nigger's. (I forgot to enter this also.)

## Wednesday, February 14, 1912

Warmer than usual with a little snow. A little after 8 a.m. the temperature was 10 degrees above zero. Fluff is six years old today. Oliver had his examination in Grammar today. I got 76 and he got 57. Christies sold a calf today.

## Thursday, February 15, 1912

Warmer than yesterday. The temperature was 8 degrees above zero about 7:30 a.m. and 22 degrees above zero a little before $10 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. [sic]

## Friday, February 16, 1912

Mild and thawing a little. The temperature was 26 degrees above zero about 7:30 a.m. and 25 degrees above zero a little before 10 p.m. [sic] Uncle Gilbert was in today and Oliver went home with him.

## Saturday, February 17, 1912

Mild and thawing a little. The temperature was 28 degrees above zero at about 9 a.m. We cleaned the stove pipes today.

## Sunday, February 18, 1912

Mild and thawing. We all went to Church today and I went to Sunday School. Oliver came in this afternoon and Noble and he went to the Methodist Church tonight.

## Monday, February 19, 1912

Mild and thawing. The temperature was 34 degrees above zero a little after 7 a.m. and 27 degrees above zero a little be[fore] 10. We had an examination in Stenography today.

Tuesday, February 20, 1912
Fine and cold. The temperature was 17 degrees above zero a little after 7 a.m. We got our marks today. Percy Nelson got 92. I got 82 and Oliver got 62.

## Wednesday, February 21, 1912

Cold and stormy. The temperature was 10 degrees below zero a little after 7 a.m.

## Thursday, February 22, 1912

Cold and stormy. The temperature was 10 degrees above zero a little after 7 a.m. The drifts are very deep today. Only one train, the early one, has come in today.

## Friday, February 23, 1912

Cold and fine. The temperature was 2 degrees above zero about 7:15 a.m. and 25 degrees above zero a little after 10 a.m. Oliver went home with Uncle Andrew and Aunt Minnie.

## Saturday, February 24, 1912

Warm and thawing a little. The temperature was 21 degrees above zero about 7:30 a.m.

## Sunday, February 25, 1912

Mild and thawing in the morning and cold in the afternoon. Oliver came in tonight. Oliver and we all went to Church in the morning and I went to Sunday School.

Monday, February 26, 1912

Cold with snow and hail. The temperature was 22 degrees above zero about 7:30 a.m. Bessie Geddes came in today to get her teeth filled. We had an examination in Geometry today.

Tuesday, February 27, 1912
Cold and stormy. The temperature was 10 degrees above zero at 7:30 a.m. Uncle Gilbert and Aunt Jeannie were in town today.

## Wednesday, February 28, 1912

Cold and stormy. The temperature was 10 degrees above zero at 7:30 a.m. We got our marks for our Geometry examination. Oliver got 90 and Percy Nelson and I both had 94.

## Thursday, February 29, 1912

Cold and fair. The temperature was 7 degrees above zero at 7:30 a.m. Johnnie came in tonight and Oliver and he went skating.

Friday, March 1, 1912
Cold and fair. The temperature was 8 degrees above zero at 7:30 a.m. Oliver went home tonight.

## Saturday, March 2, 1912

Cold and snowing. Bessie went home today.

## Sunday, March 3, 1912

Fine and cold. The temperature was 6 degrees below zero at 8:15 a.m. We were all at Church and I went to Sunday School. Oliver came in tonight.

Monday, March 4, 1912
Cold and fair. The temperature was 17 degrees below zero a little after 7:00 a.m.

## Tuesday, March 5, 1912

Fine and cold. The temperature was 14 degrees below zero at 8:15 a.m. Oliver is at the rink skating tonight. We got our marks today. Oliver got 68 and I got 82.

## Wednesday, March 6, 1912

Cold and fine. The temperature was 14 degrees below zero about 7:15 a.m.
Thursday, March 7, 1912

Milder and thawing a little. Fine and cold. The temperature was 8 degrees above zero about 7:15 a.m.

Friday, March 8, 1912
Mild and dull. Fine and cold. The temperature was 20 degrees above zero at 7:15 a.m. Oliver did not go to school today as he was sick with the cold and has not gone home tonight.

## Saturday, March 9, 1912

Cold and fine. The temperature was 2 degrees below zero about 7:15 a.m. Oliver went home today.

## Sunday, March 10, 1912

Fine and cold. The temperature was 10 degrees above zero at 8:15 a.m. We all went to Church except me for I had a bad cold. Oliver came in tonight.

## Monday, March 11, 1912

Mild and fine. The temperature was 2 degrees below zero about 7:15 a.m. We had an exam in arithmetic. I got 75, Oliver got 55.

## Tuesday, March 12, 1912

Mild and fine. Temperature 10 degrees above zero about 7:15 a.m. Uncle Andrew and Aunt Minnie and Donnie Christie were in town today. Saw first crow today.

## Wednesday, March 13, 1912

Mild and fine. Temperature 2 degrees above zero about 7:15 a.m.

## Thursday, March 14, 1912

Mild and dull though bright in early morning. Temperature 20 degrees above zero about 7:15 a.m. Saw another crow.

Friday, March 15, 1912
Cold and stormy. The temperature was 20 degrees above zero at 7:30 a.m. Oliver did not go home tonight.

## Saturday, March 16, 1912

Fine and cold. The temperature was 4 degrees above zero at 8:15 a.m. Oliver went home today on the train.

## Sunday, March 17, 1912

Fine and warm. The temperature was [blank] degrees above zero at 8 a.m. We all went to Church but [illegible].

## Monday, March 18, 1912

Fine and warm. The temperature was 26 degrees above zero about 7:15 a.m. We got our marks for Composition examination. Oliver got 72, I got 65 .

Tuesday, March 19, 1912
Fine and warm. The temperature was 32 degrees above zero about 7 a.m.

## Wednesday, March 20, 1912

Fine and cold. The temperature was 10 degrees above zero at 7:15 a.m. Had my first skate this winter. The ice is very good.

## Thursday, March 21, 1912

Cold and stormy in the morning and clearing up towards noon but snowing a little at night. Temperature 9 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Good skating today.

## Friday, March 22, 1912

Cold and fine. Temperature 12 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Oliver went home tonight.

## Saturday, March 23, 1912

Fine and mild. Temperature 8 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Uncle Gilbert and [Aunt] Jeannie were in today.

## Sunday, March 24, 1912

Fine and mild. Temperature 9 degrees above zero about 8 a.m. We all went to Church today but Ma. Noble has seen his two-hundredth crow today.

## Monday, March 25, 1912

Fine and mild. Temperature 8 degrees above zero about 7:30 a.m. We had an exam in Latin today. In the Physics exam Oliver got 52 and I got 83 .

## Tuesday, March 26, 1912

Mild and snowing in the morning, fine in the afternoon. Temperature 16 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. We got our marks today. Oliver got 68 and I got 78 .

## Wednesday, March 27, 1912

Mild and fine. Temperature 27 degrees above zero about 7:30 a.m.

Thursday, March 28, 1912
Fine and mild. Oliver and Noble climbed to the top of the standpipe today.

## Friday, March 29, 1912

Misty in the morning and fine and mild in the afternoon. Temperature 30 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Oliver went home tonight.

## Saturday, March 30, 1912

Fine and mild. Temperature 16 degrees above zero about 8:45 a.m.

## Sunday, March 31, 1912

Mild with rain and snow. Temperature 33 degrees above zero about 8 a.m. Noble, Oliver and I went to Church and I went to Sunday School. Oliver came in tonight.

Monday, April 1, 1912
Mild with snow. Temperature 16 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m. We had a history exam today. Oliver and I saw a robin today.

## Tuesday, April 2, 1912

Mild with a little snow. Temperature 13 degrees above zero about 7 a.m.

## Wednesday, April 3, 1912

Fine and cold. Temperature 10 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. We got our marks today. Oliver got 53 and I got 68.

Thursday, April 4, 1912
Fine and warm with a few sprinkles of rain. Temperature 29 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. School stopped and holidays begun. Oliver went home.

## Friday, April 5, 1912

Fine and very warm. Temperature 36 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Today is Good Friday. Snow going away fast.

## Saturday, April 6, 1912

Fine and very warm with rain in the evening. Temperature 46 degrees above zero about 8 a.m. Uncle Albert and [Aunt] Helen came in today and are going to stop in till Monday.

## Sunday, April 7, 1912

Dull and cold with much wind. Temperature 35 degrees above zero about 8 a.m.

## Monday, April 8, 1912

Fine with cold wind. Temperature 22 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. and 24 degrees above zero about 10 a.m. There are great floods. The dam on Mill Creek is carried away, also part of Denny's bridge, the dam, part of a bridge in Southampton, and the dam in Paisley. Mr. Stark was nearly drowned and some of the inhabitants had to be taken away from their homes in boats. Uncle Gilbert and [Aunt] Ellie went home today.

## Tuesday, April 9, 1912

Ground covered with snow in the morning but gone before noon. Fine in afternoon with cold wind. Temperature 32 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. and 30 degrees above zero about $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Tapped 3 trees today and got nearly 3 quarts.

## Wednesday, April 10, 1912

Fine and warm. Temperature 30 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. We got through sawing the long wood today except a few sticks to hold the pile.

## Thursday, April 11, 1912

A little rain in the morning but fine later. Temperature 28 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Noble and I walked out to Christie's today. Oliver Laurier and I were back at the sugar bush.

## Friday, April 12, 1912

Dull in the morning but fine in the afternoon. Temperature 16 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Noble and I walked back tonight.

## Saturday, April 13, 1912

Fine and warm. Temperature 29 degrees above zero about 7 a.m.

## Sunday, April 14, 1912

Very warm with rainfalls in the afternoon. Temperature 40 degrees above zero about 7 a.m.

## Monday, April 15, 1912

Hot with light showers in the afternoon. Temperature 50 degrees above zero about 6:15 a.m. Oliver, Jimmie and their grandfather were in today. High School has started again.

## Tuesday, April 16, 1912

Dull in the morning, fine in the afternoon. Warm with cold wind.
Temperature 38 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. We got our marks in spelling. Oliver got 52 and I got 68.

## Wednesday, April 17, 1912

Fine and warm. Temperature 27 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. John Burgess was here for supper. The Titanic struck an iceberg a couple of days ago and sank. Mr. C. M. Hayes was on board. It is not known who escaped and who did not. Mr. Mann is to be given a call.

## Thursday, April 18, 1912

Rain. Temperature 33 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. and 34 degrees above zero about 10 a.m.

## Friday, April 19, 1912

Fine and cold. A light fall of snow in the morning. Temperature 28 degrees above zero about 6 a.m. In the Titanic 2340 were on board. Of those 1601 were drowned and 739 saved. Among those drowned was Mr. C.M. Hays and Mr. Stead. [ name partly illegible]

## Saturday, April 20, 1912

Fine and cold. Temperature 25 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Oliver Geddes and Uncle Sandy were in town today, also James Donald and Ethel Christie.

## Sunday, April 21, 1912

Fine and warm. Temperature 39 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. We found some wild flowers today.

## Monday, April 22, 1912

Fine and warm with rain in the afternoon. Temperature 52 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Mama and Papa and Oliver went out to Burgoyne today.

## Tuesday, April 23, 1912

Cool in morning and slight snow fall in night, but warmer in the afternoon. Temperature 31 degrees above zero about 6 a.m.

## Wednesday, April 24, 1912

Cold and dull. Warmer in afternoon and finer. Temperature 41 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Were fishing today but caught nothing. I saw a Belted Kingfisher today.

## Thursday, April 25, 1912

Fine and warm. Temperature 31 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Mr. Christie was here today. J.B. Mure drove him in Southampton.

## Friday, April 26, 1912

Warm and dull with very strong wind and a sprinkling of rain in the morning. Temperature 42 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. I got 68 in B.K. and Oliver got 69 .

## Saturday, April 27, 1912

Cold with a strong wind. Temperature 34 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. Uncle Alfred, Georgina and Agnes were in town today. Uncle Sandy and Aunt Lizzie were it [sic] also.

## Sunday, April 28, 1912

Cold though a little milder. Temperature 31 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. We saw a dandelion today.

## Monday, April 29, 1912

Warmer though still cool. Temperature 37 degrees above zero about 7 a.m.

## Tuesday, April 30, 1912

Fine and warm. Temperature 36 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m. Oliver got 57 in Algebra and I got 90. Papa saw a butterfly today. We started to plant our potatoes today.

## Wednesday, May 1, 1912

Warm and fine with a little sprinkle of rain in the evening. Temperature 36 degrees above zero about 7 a.m.

## Thursday, May 2, 1912

Warm in morning and cooler in afternoon. Temperature 42 degrees above zero about 6 a.m.

Friday, May 3, 1912
Very warm. Temperature 42 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. I saw some swallows today.

## Saturday, May 4, 1012

Fine and warm. Temperature 40 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m.

## Sunday, May 5, 1912

Dull with rain. Temperature 48 degrees above zero about 7:30 a.m.

## Monday, May 6, 1912

Dull and raining in morning, but fine in afternoon. We had our examination in Phonography [Pitman shorthand] today. Jerny [spelling?] Gownlock and Minnie Robertson were visiting here tonight.

## Tuesday, May 7, 1912

Fine and hot early in the afternoon but getting cooler about 5 p.m. and a thunderstorm beginning about 6:30 p.m. and lasting all evening.
Temperature 53 degrees above zero about 6:15 a.m. We saw some coalbirds [spelling?] today.

## Wednesday, May 8, 1912

Fine and warm. Temperature 67 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m. I saw a cuckoo and a [springbird?] today.

## Thursday, May 9, 1912

Rainy and misty in the morning but fine in afternoon. Temperature 49 degrees above zero about 7:20 a.m.

## Friday, May 10, 1912

Fine and warm. I went out to Geddese's tonight on the wheel.

## Saturday, May 11, 1912

Dull and rainy. I came home with Johnnie in the wagon. Mama and Papa were up at Paisley tonight.

## Sunday, May 12, 1912

Wet and cold. Temperature 48 degrees above zero about 7 a.m. I burnt my hand today.

## Monday, May 13, 1912

Rain and snow. Temperature 48 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m. We had an exam in Geometry today. In stenography Oliver got 85 and I got 86.

Tuesday, May 14, 1912

Fine and cool. Temperature 38 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m.

## Wednesday, May 15, 1912

Fine and warm. Temperature 36 degrees above zero about 7:30 a.m.

## Thursday, May 16, 1912

Dull and rainy. Temperature 46 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m. The inspector Mr. Spotton was at school today.

## Friday, May 17, 1912

Rain in morning and fine in afternoon. Temperature 41 degrees above zero about 6:15 a.m. Johnnie and Bessie were in tonight.

## Saturday, May 18, 1912

Windy with showers in the afternoon and evening. Temperature 49 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m. We put the cow in the field for the first time.

## Sunday, May 19, 1912

Rain. Temperature 38 degrees above zero about 7 a.m.
Monday, May 20, 1912
Rain. Temperature 42 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m.

## Tuesday, May 21, 1912

Rain, clearing up in the afternoon. Temperature 44 degrees above zero about 6:30 a.m. We got our marks. Oliver got 88 and I got 89 in Grammar.

## Wednesday, May 22, 1912
