- 15 This is a very fine day, but hot. The lawn social came off last night and was a success in every way, Admission <sup>with supper</sup> 25, ice cream and candy, total receipts \$1.41.00
- 20 I got behind with my diary. I got \$1.00 sugar from M. Crimmon Peter Stewart, ordered and paid for it on the 16<sup>th</sup> or 17<sup>th</sup>. I preserved goose-berry and red currants, black currants on the 19 I sent 50 to church, we had 4 days of great heat 88 up to 92. Then it turned cool Jimmie got the hay in, there were two good loads from the meadow. On 21, Ann Hall 50
- 23 Bit 6 qts raspberries 12<sup>th</sup>

- 25 3 loaves 10 I go
- 26 Rev A Scott preached from 8 ch Romans
- 27 This is the 27, and a fine day. Mundy went to St. James Jimmie is putting up the chicken wire around the garden. Heard that Senator M. McLean is dead. I did not pay the milk Saturday

- 30 Hen feed 1.80 Ann Hall 62, Buns 15, Molasses 25 = 2.82  
Jean came by train to Lancaster, Mundy met her Jimmie went with Margaret Covin to St. Regis to meet Mrs Willie M. Pherson. Killed a hen Charlotte McGillis of Chicago, and Bessie of Gore called for a short time, Mrs Cattanach and Mrs Hamlin Jennet Black,

- 6 Farguhar Robertson took Miss McKae and her party, Mrs Ross Miss Grant & Duncan Grant down to luncheon, I thought to take them here to fix the clock, charged 1.00 Had 84 at 6 P.M.

- 10 Mrs St. Thomas girls paid 10.00 I gave them a receipt up to date
- 11 Rain last night and this morning
- 12 Mary Jane and Kate were down

S. School picnic to Hamiltons Island, I was out looking at the children going, when Jimmie came and told me if I would go D. Gunn would take me in his auto, I went and had a very pleasant day, 5 lbs butter from Browns 30<sup>th</sup> 1.80
- 14 Hen feed \$2.00 bread 12 coal oil 20 2.32
- 15 Milk 35
- 16 Church 25
- 17 Mary Gore and Mrs M. Pherson Mary had a nice cake and a pie
- 18 Ann Hall 50<sup>old</sup>
