- Thurs 11 Rain I picked all my black currants  
about 2 qts. And about 1 qt red  
I smashed the red into two sealers  
and put sugar on them, I did not boil  
Fri 12 Orange Walk at Dunvegan

- Sat 13 Milk 50. pan bread 42  
Sun 14 General fund 25  
Mon 15 Ann 70. coal oil 25, Had new potatoes  
" As I was washing the supper dishes.  
Targhee Jean and Miss Oman  
 popped in. They remained until 8:30 P.M.  
 After they left Mrs Dunlop called, she  
 is growing over the death by drowning  
 of her son Alex. Livingston on the hospital  
 ship cattle being torpedoed  
 by a German sub. 70 miles off the Irish  
 coast, The hospital ship was returning  
 from Halifax after bringing out convales-  
 cent soldiers. There were over 240 on board  
 Tues 16 kind of dull. I finished cutting the Bird  
 rocks in the garden. There is a Social to  
 night on Mrs Morrisons lawn the Red Cross  
 a light shower about 8 P.M. 2 loaves 21  
 Wed 17 Rainy today. The Social was a success  
 took in over \$2.00. I sent 2.40  
 Thurs 18  
 Fri 19  
 Sat 20 Jimmie left for Carlsbad Springs, Milk 50  
 bread 42 1 gall coal oil 25 50  
 Sun 21 Olders were appointed for our church
