- 1 New Years day Friday. Fine day. Agnes is here yet. Put a big drake in the oven at 10 A M at 12 the heat <sup>made</sup> had no impression on him at 6 P. M. he was satable
- 2 Another fine day To bread 14 milk 42
- 3 Sent to Church 25
- 4 Fine cold the first of week of prayer. George Fergusson (dandy) brought us 4 gall. maple syrup that I ordered in November 1<sup>00</sup> pr gall. The polling is going on today, at Duncan Campbells. Toward evening Tupper called for me. I got ready in a hurry and went. Our man was beaten by 17 votes
- 5 Jimmie has a bad cold
- 9 Milk 42 - 3 loaves 18
- 10 Fine and mild. Roads very slippery. I sent 50 to
- 11 Church, Communion today
- 11 Ann Hall 30<sup>cts</sup> Jimmie's cold is no better
- 12 To 2 loaves 12 1 gall coal oil 20. To ladies from Cornwall selling tickets for General Hospital
- 13 Fine and mild Murdy went to Alexandria at 4 P. M. To 5 lbs rolled oats 25
- 14 Mild day Jimmie is still coughing. The measles are in the village. At Cooks. Demos. John J. A's. They are quarantined. Cooks were discovered on Monday
- 15 To 2 loaves 14 Gave Jimmie cheque of 8<sup>00</sup>.
- 16 To 2 loaves 14 Murdy got home about 9:30 A M Milk 42. Larques quit bringing milk tonight. Far sent me 20<sup>00</sup> full telephone money
- 17 Drizzling rain all day. Stewards brought 1 qt milk. Had nothing to send to church
- 18 Miss Grant paid 36<sup>00</sup>
- 19 Murdy by 2 loaves
- 20 Lovely weather. Mary M Lennan (teacher) took tea with us

- 23 To 1 loaf Graham 7. little cake 10. 12 cookies 15  
Looks like snow Paid Murdy 25 for bread Milk 42
- 24 I sent 50 to church. Jimmie was showing tarquhar some business. Far said that John P. came in last night with Jimmie 7 to the Hospital. About 7 P. M. he was operated on for appendicitis, he is likely to get better
- 25 Stormy all day It began last night. And it is a regular Burns day
- 26 Thought Ann would come today, but she did not. Katie Christie here for supper
- 27 Ann Hall 30<sup>cts</sup> Murdy Salmon
- 28 Fine mild day 2 loaves 14 & buns 5 The Papists had a bridge party in Aberdeen Hall. Joe Doest had it. Sent a letter to Marion
- 29 Cold this morning 15 below The coldest since this year Lillian M Lennan and William Grant, Centennial, called when we were at tea. They had tea, and left about 8 P. M. They were calling on friends were at Mary James last night. Mrs Govin sent me a loaf of bread & loaf of Graham bread and a dish of pickled cabbage. Jimmie went to Cornwall by train
- 30 Cold this morning Mercury down to 23 on our therm. In the village some day 30 Coal oil 20 Milk 42 - 0-62 Got from factory 30 lbs butter
- 31 Not so cold. Snow in afternoon. Sent 50 to church fund and 50 for missions
